

Quick Guide: GDP Releases

Remember:

Each quarter's GDP is **estimated** over three consecutive months:



>> Industry data are now available with the third estimate. <<

>> Corporate profits data are not released with advance estimates. In Q4, they are released only with the third estimate. <<

When using the data, note:

Unless otherwise specified, quarterly data are annualized
Data are seasonally adjusted



Real values *Adjusted for inflation*
Tables not labeled "real" *Current dollars*
