



BEARFACTS 1995 – 2005

Sherman , Oregon [41055]

Sherman is one of 36 counties in Oregon. It is not part of a Metropolitan Area. Its 2005 population of 1,663 ranked 35th in the state.

PER CAPITA PERSONAL INCOME

In 2005 Sherman had a per capita personal income (PCPI) of \$20,732. This PCPI ranked 35th in the state and was 66 percent of the state average, \$31,599, and 60 percent of the national average, \$34,757. The 2005 PCPI reflected a decrease of 9.7 percent from 2004. The 2004-2005 state change was 3.2 percent and the national change was 4.9 percent. In 1995 the PCPI of Sherman was \$17,189 and ranked 30th in the state. The 1995-2005 average annual growth rate of PCPI was 1.9 percent. The average annual growth rate for the state was 3.6 percent and for the nation was 4.2 percent.

TOTAL PERSONAL INCOME

In 2005 Sherman had a total personal income (TPI) of \$34,478*. This TPI ranked 35th in the state and accounted for 0.0 percent of the state total. In 1995 the TPI of Sherman was \$34,171* and ranked 35th in the state. The 2005 TPI reflected a decrease of 10.1 percent from 2004. The 2004-2005 state change was 4.5 percent and the national change was 5.9 percent. The 1995-2005 average annual growth rate of TPI was 0.1 percent. The average annual growth rate for the state was 4.9 percent and for the nation was 5.3 percent.

COMPONENTS OF TOTAL PERSONAL INCOME

Total personal income includes net earnings by place of residence; dividends, interest, and rent; and personal current transfer receipts received by the residents of Sherman. In 2005 net earnings accounted for 38.1 percent of TPI (compared with 49.2 in 1995); dividends, interest, and rent were 27.0 percent (compared with 29.7 in 1995); and personal current transfer receipts were 34.8 percent (compared with 21.1 in 1995). From 2004 to 2005 net earnings decreased 18.3 percent; dividends, interest, and rent decreased 14.5 percent; and personal current transfer receipts increased 5.6 percent. From 1995 to 2005 net earnings decreased on average 2.4 percent each year; dividends, interest, and rent decreased on average 0.8 percent; and personal current transfer receipts increased on average 5.3 percent.

EARNINGS BY PLACE OF WORK

Earnings of persons employed in Sherman decreased from \$19,542* in 2004 to \$17,261* in 2005, a decrease of 11.7 percent. The 2004-2005 state change was 4.9 percent and the national change was 5.4 percent. The average annual growth rate from the 1995 estimate of \$20,183* to the 2005 estimate was - 1.6 percent. The average annual growth rate for the state was 5.4 percent and for the nation was 5.5 percent.
