



## **BEARFACTS 1995 – 2005**

### **Northumberland , Virginia [51133]**

Northumberland is one of 105 counties in Virginia. It is not part of a Metropolitan Area. Its 2005 population of 12,806 ranked 88th in the state.

#### **PER CAPITA PERSONAL INCOME**

In 2005 Northumberland had a per capita personal income (PCPI) of \$30,616. This PCPI ranked 39th in the state and was 81 percent of the state average, \$37,968, and 88 percent of the national average, \$34,757. The 2005 PCPI reflected an increase of 4.0 percent from 2004. The 2004-2005 state change was 5.9 percent and the national change was 4.9 percent. In 1995 the PCPI of Northumberland was \$19,185 and ranked 47th in the state. The 1995-2005 average annual growth rate of PCPI was 4.8 percent. The average annual growth rate for the state was 4.7 percent and for the nation was 4.2 percent.

#### **TOTAL PERSONAL INCOME**

In 2005 Northumberland had a total personal income (TPI) of \$392,072\*. This TPI ranked 76th in the state and accounted for 0.1 percent of the state total. In 1995 the TPI of Northumberland was \$219,419\* and ranked 84th in the state. The 2005 TPI reflected an increase of 4.6 percent from 2004. The 2004-2005 state change was 7.3 percent and the national change was 5.9 percent. The 1995-2005 average annual growth rate of TPI was 6.0 percent. The average annual growth rate for the state was 6.0 percent and for the nation was 5.3 percent.

#### **COMPONENTS OF TOTAL PERSONAL INCOME**

Total personal income includes net earnings by place of residence; dividends, interest, and rent; and personal current transfer receipts received by the residents of Northumberland. In 2005 net earnings accounted for 43.1 percent of TPI (compared with 46.2 in 1995); dividends, interest, and rent were 34.5 percent (compared with 31.5 in 1995); and personal current transfer receipts were 22.4 percent (compared with 22.3 in 1995). From 2004 to 2005 net earnings increased 6.3 percent; dividends, interest, and rent increased 0.2 percent; and personal current transfer receipts increased 8.3 percent. From 1995 to 2005 net earnings increased on average 5.2 percent each year; dividends, interest, and rent increased on average 6.9 percent; and personal current transfer receipts increased on average 6.0 percent.

#### **EARNINGS BY PLACE OF WORK**

Earnings of persons employed in Northumberland increased from \$112,057\* in 2004 to \$119,148\* in 2005, an increase of 6.3 percent. The 2004-2005 state change was 7.0 percent and the national change was 5.4 percent. The average annual growth rate from the 1995 estimate of \$79,698\* to the 2005 estimate was 4.1 percent. The average annual growth rate for the state was 6.6 percent and for the nation was 5.5 percent.

*\*Note: All income estimates with the exception of PCPI are in thousands of dollars, not adjusted for inflation.*
