



BEARFACTS 1988 – 1998

Polk , Florida [12105]

Polk is one of 67 counties in Florida. It is part of the [Lakeland-Winter Haven, FL \(MSA\)](#). Its 1998 population of 471,450 ranked 8th in the state.

PER CAPITA PERSONAL INCOME

In 1998 Polk had a per capita personal income (PCPI) of \$22,213. This PCPI ranked 25th in the state and was 85 percent of the state average, \$25,987, and 83 percent of the national average, \$26,883. The 1998 PCPI reflected an increase of 7.9 percent from 1997. The 1997-1998 state change was 6.1 percent and the national change was 6.1 percent. In 1988 the PCPI of Polk was \$14,441 and ranked 32nd in the state. The 1988-1998 average annual growth rate of PCPI was 4.4 percent. The average annual growth rate for the state was 4.1 percent and for the nation was 4.5 percent.

TOTAL PERSONAL INCOME

In 1998 Polk had a total personal income (TPI) of \$10,472,253*. This TPI ranked 11th in the state and accounted for 2.6 percent of the state total. In 1988 the TPI of Polk was \$5,620,033* and ranked 10th in the state. The 1998 TPI reflected an increase of 9.8 percent from 1997. The 1997-1998 state change was 8.2 percent and the national change was 7.4 percent. The 1988-1998 average annual growth rate of TPI was 6.4 percent. The average annual growth rate for the state was 6.5 percent and for the nation was 5.8 percent.

COMPONENTS OF TOTAL PERSONAL INCOME

Total personal income includes net earnings by place of residence; dividends, interest, and rent; and personal current transfer receipts received by the residents of Polk. In 1998 net earnings accounted for 61.2 percent of TPI (compared with 63.0 in 1988); dividends, interest, and rent were 21.3 percent (compared with 22.4 in 1988); and personal current transfer receipts were 17.5 percent (compared with 14.6 in 1988). From 1997 to 1998 net earnings increased 10.3 percent; dividends, interest, and rent increased 14.6 percent; and personal current transfer receipts increased 2.8 percent. From 1988 to 1998 net earnings increased on average 6.1 percent each year; dividends, interest, and rent increased on average 5.9 percent; and personal current transfer receipts increased on average 8.4 percent.

EARNINGS BY PLACE OF WORK

Earnings of persons employed in Polk increased from \$6,063,394* in 1997 to \$6,646,046* in 1998, an increase of 9.6 percent. The 1997-1998 state change was 8.7 percent and the national change was 7.8 percent. The average annual growth rate from the 1988 estimate of \$4,012,001* to the 1998 estimate was 5.2 percent. The average annual growth rate for the state was 6.2 percent and for the nation was 5.5 percent.
