



BEARFACTS 1988 – 1998

New Madrid , Missouri [29143]

New Madrid is one of 115 counties in Missouri. It is not part of a Metropolitan Area. Its 1998 population of 20,346 ranked 54th in the state.

PER CAPITA PERSONAL INCOME

In 1998 New Madrid had a per capita personal income (PCPI) of \$16,957. This PCPI ranked 88th in the state and was 68 percent of the state average, \$24,923, and 63 percent of the national average, \$26,883. The 1998 PCPI reflected a decrease of 0.4 percent from 1997. The 1997-1998 state change was 5.1 percent and the national change was 6.1 percent. In 1988 the PCPI of New Madrid was \$12,071 and ranked 57th in the state. The 1988-1998 average annual growth rate of PCPI was 3.5 percent. The average annual growth rate for the state was 4.5 percent and for the nation was 4.5 percent.

TOTAL PERSONAL INCOME

In 1998 New Madrid had a total personal income (TPI) of \$344,999*. This TPI ranked 57th in the state and accounted for 0.3 percent of the state total. In 1988 the TPI of New Madrid was \$254,824* and ranked 43rd in the state. The 1998 TPI reflected a decrease of 1.2 percent from 1997. The 1997-1998 state change was 5.9 percent and the national change was 7.4 percent. The 1988-1998 average annual growth rate of TPI was 3.1 percent. The average annual growth rate for the state was 5.4 percent and for the nation was 5.8 percent.

COMPONENTS OF TOTAL PERSONAL INCOME

Total personal income includes net earnings by place of residence; dividends, interest, and rent; and personal current transfer receipts received by the residents of New Madrid. In 1998 net earnings accounted for 58.2 percent of TPI (compared with 66.7 in 1988); dividends, interest, and rent were 15.0 percent (compared with 14.6 in 1988); and personal current transfer receipts were 26.8 percent (compared with 18.7 in 1988). From 1997 to 1998 net earnings decreased 2.1 percent; dividends, interest, and rent increased 4.0 percent; and personal current transfer receipts decreased 2.1 percent. From 1988 to 1998 net earnings increased on average 1.7 percent each year; dividends, interest, and rent increased on average 3.3 percent; and personal current transfer receipts increased on average 6.9 percent.

EARNINGS BY PLACE OF WORK

Earnings of persons employed in New Madrid decreased from \$277,946* in 1997 to \$275,790* in 1998, a decrease of 0.8 percent. The 1997-1998 state change was 6.2 percent and the national change was 7.8 percent. The average annual growth rate from the 1988 estimate of \$232,536* to the 1998 estimate was 1.7 percent. The average annual growth rate for the state was 5.2 percent and for the nation was 5.5 percent.
