



BEARFACTS 1988 – 1998

Scotland , Missouri [29199]

Scotland is one of 115 counties in Missouri. It is not part of a Metropolitan Area. Its 1998 population of 4,878 ranked 111th in the state.

PER CAPITA PERSONAL INCOME

In 1998 Scotland had a per capita personal income (PCPI) of \$18,366. This PCPI ranked 65th in the state and was 74 percent of the state average, \$24,923, and 68 percent of the national average, \$26,883. The 1998 PCPI reflected a decrease of 3.8 percent from 1997. The 1997-1998 state change was 5.1 percent and the national change was 6.1 percent. In 1988 the PCPI of Scotland was \$11,308 and ranked 77th in the state. The 1988-1998 average annual growth rate of PCPI was 5.0 percent. The average annual growth rate for the state was 4.5 percent and for the nation was 4.5 percent.

TOTAL PERSONAL INCOME

In 1998 Scotland had a total personal income (TPI) of \$89,587*. This TPI ranked 110th in the state and accounted for 0.1 percent of the state total. In 1988 the TPI of Scotland was \$56,200* and ranked 109th in the state. The 1998 TPI reflected a decrease of 4.5 percent from 1997. The 1997-1998 state change was 5.9 percent and the national change was 7.4 percent. The 1988-1998 average annual growth rate of TPI was 4.8 percent. The average annual growth rate for the state was 5.4 percent and for the nation was 5.8 percent.

COMPONENTS OF TOTAL PERSONAL INCOME

Total personal income includes net earnings by place of residence; dividends, interest, and rent; and personal current transfer receipts received by the residents of Scotland. In 1998 net earnings accounted for 51.8 percent of TPI (compared with 49.1 in 1988); dividends, interest, and rent were 24.3 percent (compared with 30.4 in 1988); and personal current transfer receipts were 23.9 percent (compared with 20.5 in 1988). From 1997 to 1998 net earnings decreased 10.6 percent; dividends, interest, and rent increased 6.0 percent; and personal current transfer receipts increased 0.1 percent. From 1988 to 1998 net earnings increased on average 5.3 percent each year; dividends, interest, and rent increased on average 2.5 percent; and personal current transfer receipts increased on average 6.4 percent.

EARNINGS BY PLACE OF WORK

Earnings of persons employed in Scotland decreased from \$48,629* in 1997 to \$42,564* in 1998, a decrease of 12.5 percent. The 1997-1998 state change was 6.2 percent and the national change was 7.8 percent. The average annual growth rate from the 1988 estimate of \$27,631* to the 1998 estimate was 4.4 percent. The average annual growth rate for the state was 5.2 percent and for the nation was 5.5 percent.
