



BEARFACTS 1988 – 1998

Richmond , North Carolina [37153]

Richmond is one of 100 counties in North Carolina. It is part of the Rockingham, NC Micropolitan SA. Its 1998 population of 46,558 ranked 50th in the state.

PER CAPITA PERSONAL INCOME

In 1998 Richmond had a per capita personal income (PCPI) of \$18,693. This PCPI ranked 84th in the state and was 76 percent of the state average, \$24,743, and 70 percent of the national average, \$26,883. The 1998 PCPI reflected an increase of 4.4 percent from 1997. The 1997-1998 state change was 5.2 percent and the national change was 6.1 percent. In 1988 the PCPI of Richmond was \$11,715 and ranked 79th in the state. The 1988-1998 average annual growth rate of PCPI was 4.8 percent. The average annual growth rate for the state was 4.9 percent and for the nation was 4.5 percent.

TOTAL PERSONAL INCOME

In 1998 Richmond had a total personal income (TPI) of \$870,291*. This TPI ranked 54th in the state and accounted for 0.5 percent of the state total. In 1988 the TPI of Richmond was \$522,777* and ranked 50th in the state. The 1998 TPI reflected an increase of 4.8 percent from 1997. The 1997-1998 state change was 7.2 percent and the national change was 7.4 percent. The 1988-1998 average annual growth rate of TPI was 5.2 percent. The average annual growth rate for the state was 6.8 percent and for the nation was 5.8 percent.

COMPONENTS OF TOTAL PERSONAL INCOME

Total personal income includes net earnings by place of residence; dividends, interest, and rent; and personal current transfer receipts received by the residents of Richmond. In 1998 net earnings accounted for 59.6 percent of TPI (compared with 68.5 in 1988); dividends, interest, and rent were 14.2 percent (compared with 13.8 in 1988); and personal current transfer receipts were 26.2 percent (compared with 17.7 in 1988). From 1997 to 1998 net earnings increased 5.1 percent; dividends, interest, and rent increased 5.2 percent; and personal current transfer receipts increased 4.0 percent. From 1988 to 1998 net earnings increased on average 3.8 percent each year; dividends, interest, and rent increased on average 5.6 percent; and personal current transfer receipts increased on average 9.4 percent.

EARNINGS BY PLACE OF WORK

Earnings of persons employed in Richmond increased from \$529,174* in 1997 to \$552,483* in 1998, an increase of 4.4 percent. The 1997-1998 state change was 7.2 percent and the national change was 7.8 percent. The average annual growth rate from the 1988 estimate of \$397,843* to the 1998 estimate was 3.3 percent. The average annual growth rate for the state was 6.3 percent and for the nation was 5.5 percent.
