



BEARFACTS 1988 – 1998

Utah , Utah [49049]

Utah is one of 29 counties in Utah. It is part of the [Provo-Orem, UT \(MSA\)](#). Its 1998 population of 353,365 ranked 2nd in the state.

PER CAPITA PERSONAL INCOME

In 1998 Utah had a per capita personal income (PCPI) of \$17,797. This PCPI ranked 15th in the state and was 82 percent of the state average, \$21,708, and 66 percent of the national average, \$26,883. The 1998 PCPI reflected an increase of 6.6 percent from 1997. The 1997-1998 state change was 5.4 percent and the national change was 6.1 percent. In 1988 the PCPI of Utah was \$10,399 and ranked 23rd in the state. The 1988-1998 average annual growth rate of PCPI was 5.5 percent. The average annual growth rate for the state was 5.1 percent and for the nation was 4.5 percent.

TOTAL PERSONAL INCOME

In 1998 Utah had a total personal income (TPI) of \$6,288,951*. This TPI ranked 2nd in the state and accounted for 13.4 percent of the state total. In 1988 the TPI of Utah was \$2,644,095* and ranked 2nd in the state. The 1998 TPI reflected an increase of 10.7 percent from 1997. The 1997-1998 state change was 7.7 percent and the national change was 7.4 percent. The 1988-1998 average annual growth rate of TPI was 9.1 percent. The average annual growth rate for the state was 7.8 percent and for the nation was 5.8 percent.

COMPONENTS OF TOTAL PERSONAL INCOME

Total personal income includes net earnings by place of residence; dividends, interest, and rent; and personal current transfer receipts received by the residents of Utah. In 1998 net earnings accounted for 74.5 percent of TPI (compared with 69.6 in 1988); dividends, interest, and rent were 14.6 percent (compared with 17.5 in 1988); and personal current transfer receipts were 10.9 percent (compared with 12.9 in 1988). From 1997 to 1998 net earnings increased 11.4 percent; dividends, interest, and rent increased 11.3 percent; and personal current transfer receipts increased 5.0 percent. From 1988 to 1998 net earnings increased on average 9.8 percent each year; dividends, interest, and rent increased on average 7.1 percent; and personal current transfer receipts increased on average 7.2 percent.

EARNINGS BY PLACE OF WORK

Earnings of persons employed in Utah increased from \$4,386,138* in 1997 to \$4,881,576* in 1998, an increase of 11.3 percent. The 1997-1998 state change was 7.9 percent and the national change was 7.8 percent. The average annual growth rate from the 1988 estimate of \$1,879,134* to the 1998 estimate was 10.0 percent. The average annual growth rate for the state was 8.1 percent and for the nation was 5.5 percent.
