



BEARFACTS 1988 – 1998

Teton , Wyoming [56039]

Teton is one of 23 counties in Wyoming. It is part of the Jackson, WY-ID Micropolitan SA. Its 1998 population of 16,883 ranked 10th in the state.

PER CAPITA PERSONAL INCOME

In 1998 Teton had a per capita personal income (PCPI) of \$53,872. This PCPI ranked 1st in the state and was 217 percent of the state average, \$24,836, and 200 percent of the national average, \$26,883. The 1998 PCPI reflected an increase of 11.0 percent from 1997. The 1997-1998 state change was 6.1 percent and the national change was 6.1 percent. In 1988 the PCPI of Teton was \$26,120 and ranked 1st in the state. The 1988-1998 average annual growth rate of PCPI was 7.5 percent. The average annual growth rate for the state was 5.2 percent and for the nation was 4.5 percent.

TOTAL PERSONAL INCOME

In 1998 Teton had a total personal income (TPI) of \$909,523*. This TPI ranked 4th in the state and accounted for 7.5 percent of the state total. In 1988 the TPI of Teton was \$277,157* and ranked 9th in the state. The 1998 TPI reflected an increase of 15.8 percent from 1997. The 1997-1998 state change was 6.4 percent and the national change was 7.4 percent. The 1988-1998 average annual growth rate of TPI was 12.6 percent. The average annual growth rate for the state was 5.8 percent and for the nation was 5.8 percent.

COMPONENTS OF TOTAL PERSONAL INCOME

Total personal income includes net earnings by place of residence; dividends, interest, and rent; and personal current transfer receipts received by the residents of Teton. In 1998 net earnings accounted for 47.8 percent of TPI (compared with 59.9 in 1988); dividends, interest, and rent were 48.7 percent (compared with 34.9 in 1988); and personal current transfer receipts were 3.5 percent (compared with 5.2 in 1988). From 1997 to 1998 net earnings increased 8.3 percent; dividends, interest, and rent increased 25.4 percent; and personal current transfer receipts increased 2.9 percent. From 1988 to 1998 net earnings increased on average 10.1 percent each year; dividends, interest, and rent increased on average 16.4 percent; and personal current transfer receipts increased on average 8.3 percent.

EARNINGS BY PLACE OF WORK

Earnings of persons employed in Teton increased from \$499,039* in 1997 to \$544,235* in 1998, an increase of 9.1 percent. The 1997-1998 state change was 4.1 percent and the national change was 7.8 percent. The average annual growth rate from the 1988 estimate of \$195,797* to the 1998 estimate was 10.8 percent. The average annual growth rate for the state was 4.8 percent and for the nation was 5.5 percent.
