



BEARFACTS 1988 – 1998

Burlington-South Burlington (BEA-EA) [57024]

Burlington-South Burlington is one of 179 BEA Economic Areas in the nation. Its 1998 population of 365,077 ranked 131st in the nation.

PER CAPITA PERSONAL INCOME

In 1998 Burlington-South Burlington had a per capita personal income (PCPI) of \$24,762. This PCPI ranked 52nd in the United States and was 92 percent of the national average, \$26,883. The 1998 PCPI reflected an increase of 7.1 percent from 1997. The 1997-1998 national change was 6.1 percent. In 1988 the PCPI of Burlington-South Burlington was \$15,941 and ranked 48th in the United States. The 1988-1998 average annual growth rate of PCPI was 4.5 percent. The average annual growth rate for the nation was 4.5 percent.

TOTAL PERSONAL INCOME

In 1998 Burlington-South Burlington had a total personal income (TPI) of \$9,039,972*. This TPI ranked 125th in the United States. In 1988 the TPI of Burlington-South Burlington was \$5,212,681* and ranked 126th in the United States. The 1998 TPI reflected an increase of 7.8 percent from 1997. The 1997-1998 national change was 7.4 percent. The 1988-1998 average annual growth rate of TPI was 5.7 percent. The average annual growth rate for the nation was 5.8 percent.

COMPONENTS OF TOTAL PERSONAL INCOME

Total personal income includes net earnings by place of residence; dividends, interest, and rent; and personal current transfer receipts received by the residents of Burlington-South Burlington. In 1998 net earnings accounted for 67.2 percent of TPI (compared with 70.9 in 1988); dividends, interest, and rent were 19.7 percent (compared with 18.2 in 1988); and personal current transfer receipts were 13.1 percent (compared with 10.9 in 1988). From 1997 to 1998 net earnings increased 8.0 percent; dividends, interest, and rent increased 10.0 percent; and personal current transfer receipts increased 4.1 percent. From 1988 to 1998 net earnings increased on average 5.1 percent each year; dividends, interest, and rent increased on average 6.5 percent; and personal current transfer receipts increased on average 7.6 percent.

EARNINGS BY PLACE OF WORK

Earnings of persons employed in Burlington-South Burlington increased from \$6,429,149* in 1997 to \$6,921,980* in 1998, an increase of 7.7 percent. The 1997-1998 national change was 7.8 percent. The average annual growth rate from the 1988 estimate of \$4,201,251* to the 1998 estimate was 5.1 percent. The average annual growth rate for the nation was 5.5 percent.
