



BEARFACTS 1989 – 1999

Yakutat City and Borough , Alaska [02282]

Yakutat City and Borough[†] is one of 27 counties in Alaska. It is not part of a Metropolitan Area. Its 1999 population of 843 ranked 27th in the state.

PER CAPITA PERSONAL INCOME

In 1999 Yakutat City and Borough had a per capita personal income (PCPI) of \$24,738. This PCPI ranked 16th in the state and was 88 percent of the state average, \$28,100, and 89 percent of the national average, \$27,939. The 1999 PCPI reflected a decrease of 5.7 percent from 1998. The 1998-1999 state change was 2.0 percent and the national change was 3.9 percent.

TOTAL PERSONAL INCOME

In 1999 Yakutat City and Borough had a total personal income (TPI) of \$20,854*. This TPI ranked 27th in the state and accounted for 0.1 percent of the state total. The 1999 TPI reflected a decrease of 6.3 percent from 1998. The 1998-1999 state change was 2.8 percent and the national change was 5.1 percent.

COMPONENTS OF TOTAL PERSONAL INCOME

Total personal income includes net earnings by place of residence; dividends, interest, and rent; and personal current transfer receipts received by the residents of Yakutat City and Borough. In 1999 net earnings accounted for 55.5 percent of TPI; dividends, interest, and rent were 23.8 percent; and personal current transfer receipts were 20.7 percent. From 1998 to 1999 net earnings decreased 13.0 percent; dividends, interest, and rent decreased 3.8 percent; and personal current transfer receipts increased 13.4 percent. From 1989 to 1999 net earnings cannot be calculated; the growth rate for dividends, interest, and rent cannot be calculated; the growth rate for personal current transfer receipts cannot be calculated.

EARNINGS BY PLACE OF WORK

Earnings of persons employed in Yakutat City and Borough decreased from \$17,339* in 1998 to \$15,010* in 1999, a decrease of 13.4 percent. The 1998-1999 state change was 1.8 percent and the national change was 6.8 percent.
