



BEARFACTS 1989 – 1999

Cheyenne , Colorado [08017]

Cheyenne is one of 63 counties in Colorado. It is not part of a Metropolitan Area. Its 1999 population of 2,255 ranked 57th in the state.

PER CAPITA PERSONAL INCOME

In 1999 Cheyenne had a per capita personal income (PCPI) of \$29,376. This PCPI ranked 14th in the state and was 96 percent of the state average, \$30,492, and 105 percent of the national average, \$27,939. The 1999 PCPI reflected an increase of 17.0 percent from 1998. The 1998-1999 state change was 5.9 percent and the national change was 3.9 percent. In 1989 the PCPI of Cheyenne was \$16,019 and ranked 26th in the state. The 1989-1999 average annual growth rate of PCPI was 6.3 percent. The average annual growth rate for the state was 5.1 percent and for the nation was 4.2 percent.

TOTAL PERSONAL INCOME

In 1999 Cheyenne had a total personal income (TPI) of \$66,242*. This TPI ranked 56th in the state and accounted for 0.1 percent of the state total. In 1989 the TPI of Cheyenne was \$38,478* and ranked 54th in the state. The 1999 TPI reflected an increase of 13.1 percent from 1998. The 1998-1999 state change was 8.7 percent and the national change was 5.1 percent. The 1989-1999 average annual growth rate of TPI was 5.6 percent. The average annual growth rate for the state was 7.8 percent and for the nation was 5.5 percent.

COMPONENTS OF TOTAL PERSONAL INCOME

Total personal income includes net earnings by place of residence; dividends, interest, and rent; and personal current transfer receipts received by the residents of Cheyenne. In 1999 net earnings accounted for 66.2 percent of TPI (compared with 57.2 in 1989); dividends, interest, and rent were 20.7 percent (compared with 30.5 in 1989); and personal current transfer receipts were 13.1 percent (compared with 12.3 in 1989). From 1998 to 1999 net earnings increased 21.3 percent; dividends, interest, and rent decreased 3.6 percent; and personal current transfer receipts increased 5.9 percent. From 1989 to 1999 net earnings increased on average 7.1 percent each year; dividends, interest, and rent increased on average 1.6 percent; and personal current transfer receipts increased on average 6.3 percent.

EARNINGS BY PLACE OF WORK

Earnings of persons employed in Cheyenne increased from \$42,811* in 1998 to \$50,253* in 1999, an increase of 17.4 percent. The 1998-1999 state change was 10.9 percent and the national change was 6.8 percent. The average annual growth rate from the 1989 estimate of \$25,056* to the 1999 estimate was 7.2 percent. The average annual growth rate for the state was 8.2 percent and for the nation was 5.6 percent.
