



BEARFACTS 1989 – 1999

Greenville (MSA) [24780]

Greenville is one of 363 Metropolitan Statistical Areas (MSAs) in the nation. Its 1999 population of 151,241 ranked 240th in the nation.

PER CAPITA PERSONAL INCOME

In 1999 Greenville had a per capita personal income (PCPI) of \$21,462. This PCPI ranked 307th in the United States and was 77 percent of the national average, \$27,939. The 1999 PCPI reflected a decrease of 1.6 percent from 1998. The 1998-1999 national change was 3.9 percent. In 1989 the PCPI of Greenville was \$15,204 and ranked 251st in the United States. The 1989-1999 average annual growth rate of PCPI was 3.5 percent. The average annual growth rate for the nation was 4.2 percent.

TOTAL PERSONAL INCOME

In 1999 Greenville had a total personal income (TPI) of \$3,245,968*. This TPI ranked 255th in the United States. In 1989 the TPI of Greenville was \$1,852,602* and ranked 266th in the United States. The 1999 TPI reflected a decrease of 0.2 percent from 1998. The 1998-1999 national change was 5.1 percent. The 1989-1999 average annual growth rate of TPI was 5.8 percent. The average annual growth rate for the nation was 5.5 percent.

COMPONENTS OF TOTAL PERSONAL INCOME

Total personal income includes net earnings by place of residence; dividends, interest, and rent; and personal current transfer receipts received by the residents of Greenville. In 1999 net earnings accounted for 67.9 percent of TPI (compared with 70.3 in 1989); dividends, interest, and rent were 15.3 percent (compared with 18.5 in 1989); and personal current transfer receipts were 16.8 percent (compared with 11.2 in 1989). From 1998 to 1999 net earnings increased 4.0 percent; dividends, interest, and rent decreased 23.0 percent; and personal current transfer receipts increased 11.8 percent. From 1989 to 1999 net earnings increased on average 5.4 percent each year; dividends, interest, and rent increased on average 3.8 percent; and personal current transfer receipts increased on average 10.2 percent.

EARNINGS BY PLACE OF WORK

Earnings of persons employed in Greenville increased from \$2,268,877* in 1998 to \$2,413,215* in 1999, an increase of 6.4 percent. The 1998-1999 national change was 6.8 percent. The average annual growth rate from the 1989 estimate of \$1,345,592* to the 1999 estimate was 6.0 percent. The average annual growth rate for the nation was 5.6 percent.
