



BEARFACTS 1989 – 1999

Harding , New Mexico [35021]

Harding is one of 33 counties in New Mexico. It is not part of a Metropolitan Area. Its 1999 population of 829 ranked 33rd in the state.

PER CAPITA PERSONAL INCOME

In 1999 Harding had a per capita personal income (PCPI) of \$16,848. This PCPI ranked 21st in the state and was 80 percent of the state average, \$21,042, and 60 percent of the national average, \$27,939. The 1999 PCPI reflected an increase of 2.7 percent from 1998. The 1998-1999 state change was 1.9 percent and the national change was 3.9 percent. In 1989 the PCPI of Harding was \$12,299 and ranked 17th in the state. The 1989-1999 average annual growth rate of PCPI was 3.2 percent. The average annual growth rate for the state was 4.1 percent and for the nation was 4.2 percent.

TOTAL PERSONAL INCOME

In 1999 Harding had a total personal income (TPI) of \$13,967*. This TPI ranked 33rd in the state and accounted for 0.0 percent of the state total. In 1989 the TPI of Harding was \$12,188* and ranked 33rd in the state. The 1999 TPI reflected a decrease of 3.4 percent from 1998. The 1998-1999 state change was 2.7 percent and the national change was 5.1 percent. The 1989-1999 average annual growth rate of TPI was 1.4 percent. The average annual growth rate for the state was 6.0 percent and for the nation was 5.5 percent.

COMPONENTS OF TOTAL PERSONAL INCOME

Total personal income includes net earnings by place of residence; dividends, interest, and rent; and personal current transfer receipts received by the residents of Harding. In 1999 net earnings accounted for 52.1 percent of TPI (compared with 49.6 in 1989); dividends, interest, and rent were 22.9 percent (compared with 31.2 in 1989); and personal current transfer receipts were 25.1 percent (compared with 19.3 in 1989). From 1998 to 1999 net earnings decreased 4.8 percent; dividends, interest, and rent decreased 8.2 percent; and personal current transfer receipts increased 5.0 percent. From 1989 to 1999 net earnings increased on average 1.9 percent each year; dividends, interest, and rent decreased on average 1.7 percent; and personal current transfer receipts increased on average 4.1 percent.

EARNINGS BY PLACE OF WORK

Earnings of persons employed in Harding decreased from \$7,859* in 1998 to \$7,587* in 1999, a decrease of 3.5 percent. The 1998-1999 state change was 3.6 percent and the national change was 6.8 percent. The average annual growth rate from the 1989 estimate of \$5,810* to the 1999 estimate was 2.7 percent. The average annual growth rate for the state was 5.8 percent and for the nation was 5.6 percent.
