



BEARFACTS 1989 – 1999

Beaver , Oklahoma [40007]

Beaver is one of 77 counties in Oklahoma. It is not part of a Metropolitan Area. Its 1999 population of 6,024 ranked 69th in the state.

PER CAPITA PERSONAL INCOME

In 1999 Beaver had a per capita personal income (PCPI) of \$22,266. This PCPI ranked 11th in the state and was 99 percent of the state average, \$22,567, and 80 percent of the national average, \$27,939. The 1999 PCPI reflected an increase of 10.7 percent from 1998. The 1998-1999 state change was 3.7 percent and the national change was 3.9 percent. In 1989 the PCPI of Beaver was \$14,542 and ranked 17th in the state. The 1989-1999 average annual growth rate of PCPI was 4.4 percent. The average annual growth rate for the state was 4.0 percent and for the nation was 4.2 percent.

TOTAL PERSONAL INCOME

In 1999 Beaver had a total personal income (TPI) of \$134,129*. This TPI ranked 65th in the state and accounted for 0.2 percent of the state total. In 1989 the TPI of Beaver was \$90,219* and ranked 68th in the state. The 1999 TPI reflected an increase of 10.4 percent from 1998. The 1998-1999 state change was 4.7 percent and the national change was 5.1 percent. The 1989-1999 average annual growth rate of TPI was 4.0 percent. The average annual growth rate for the state was 4.9 percent and for the nation was 5.5 percent.

COMPONENTS OF TOTAL PERSONAL INCOME

Total personal income includes net earnings by place of residence; dividends, interest, and rent; and personal current transfer receipts received by the residents of Beaver. In 1999 net earnings accounted for 64.5 percent of TPI (compared with 54.9 in 1989); dividends, interest, and rent were 21.6 percent (compared with 32.6 in 1989); and personal current transfer receipts were 13.9 percent (compared with 12.5 in 1989). From 1998 to 1999 net earnings increased 16.7 percent; dividends, interest, and rent decreased 0.8 percent; and personal current transfer receipts increased 2.7 percent. From 1989 to 1999 net earnings increased on average 5.7 percent each year; dividends, interest, and rent decreased on average 0.2 percent; and personal current transfer receipts increased on average 5.2 percent.

EARNINGS BY PLACE OF WORK

Earnings of persons employed in Beaver increased from \$63,049* in 1998 to \$73,641* in 1999, an increase of 16.8 percent. The 1998-1999 state change was 5.3 percent and the national change was 6.8 percent. The average annual growth rate from the 1989 estimate of \$49,064* to the 1999 estimate was 4.1 percent. The average annual growth rate for the state was 4.9 percent and for the nation was 5.6 percent.
