



## **BEARFACTS 1989 – 1999**

### **Harmon , Oklahoma [40057]**

Harmon is one of 77 counties in Oklahoma. It is not part of a Metropolitan Area. Its 1999 population of 3,278 ranked 76th in the state.

#### **PER CAPITA PERSONAL INCOME**

In 1999 Harmon had a per capita personal income (PCPI) of \$18,991. This PCPI ranked 35th in the state and was 84 percent of the state average, \$22,567, and 68 percent of the national average, \$27,939. The 1999 PCPI reflected an increase of 8.6 percent from 1998. The 1998-1999 state change was 3.7 percent and the national change was 3.9 percent. In 1989 the PCPI of Harmon was \$12,152 and ranked 46th in the state. The 1989-1999 average annual growth rate of PCPI was 4.6 percent. The average annual growth rate for the state was 4.0 percent and for the nation was 4.2 percent.

#### **TOTAL PERSONAL INCOME**

In 1999 Harmon had a total personal income (TPI) of \$62,254\*. This TPI ranked 77th in the state and accounted for 0.1 percent of the state total. In 1989 the TPI of Harmon was \$47,344\* and ranked 77th in the state. The 1999 TPI reflected an increase of 3.7 percent from 1998. The 1998-1999 state change was 4.7 percent and the national change was 5.1 percent. The 1989-1999 average annual growth rate of TPI was 2.8 percent. The average annual growth rate for the state was 4.9 percent and for the nation was 5.5 percent.

#### **COMPONENTS OF TOTAL PERSONAL INCOME**

Total personal income includes net earnings by place of residence; dividends, interest, and rent; and personal current transfer receipts received by the residents of Harmon. In 1999 net earnings accounted for 56.6 percent of TPI (compared with 52.2 in 1989); dividends, interest, and rent were 17.0 percent (compared with 22.5 in 1989); and personal current transfer receipts were 26.4 percent (compared with 25.4 in 1989). From 1998 to 1999 net earnings increased 7.5 percent; dividends, interest, and rent decreased 2.1 percent; and personal current transfer receipts increased 0.1 percent. From 1989 to 1999 net earnings increased on average 3.6 percent each year; dividends, interest, and rent remained unchanged; and personal current transfer receipts increased on average 3.2 percent.

#### **EARNINGS BY PLACE OF WORK**

Earnings of persons employed in Harmon increased from \$31,964\* in 1998 to \$33,663\* in 1999, an increase of 5.3 percent. The 1998-1999 state change was 5.3 percent and the national change was 6.8 percent. The average annual growth rate from the 1989 estimate of \$25,133\* to the 1999 estimate was 3.0 percent. The average annual growth rate for the state was 4.9 percent and for the nation was 5.6 percent.
