



BEARFACTS 1989 – 1999

Texas , Oklahoma [40139]

Texas is one of 77 counties in Oklahoma. It is part of the Guymon, OK Micropolitan SA. Its 1999 population of 19,878 ranked 40th in the state.

PER CAPITA PERSONAL INCOME

In 1999 Texas had a per capita personal income (PCPI) of \$28,775. This PCPI ranked 2nd in the state and was 128 percent of the state average, \$22,567, and 103 percent of the national average, \$27,939. The 1999 PCPI reflected an increase of 16.0 percent from 1998. The 1998-1999 state change was 3.7 percent and the national change was 3.9 percent. In 1989 the PCPI of Texas was \$14,469 and ranked 18th in the state. The 1989-1999 average annual growth rate of PCPI was 7.1 percent. The average annual growth rate for the state was 4.0 percent and for the nation was 4.2 percent.

TOTAL PERSONAL INCOME

In 1999 Texas had a total personal income (TPI) of \$571,999*. This TPI ranked 33rd in the state and accounted for 0.7 percent of the state total. In 1989 the TPI of Texas was \$238,119* and ranked 39th in the state. The 1999 TPI reflected an increase of 16.5 percent from 1998. The 1998-1999 state change was 4.7 percent and the national change was 5.1 percent. The 1989-1999 average annual growth rate of TPI was 9.2 percent. The average annual growth rate for the state was 4.9 percent and for the nation was 5.5 percent.

COMPONENTS OF TOTAL PERSONAL INCOME

Total personal income includes net earnings by place of residence; dividends, interest, and rent; and personal current transfer receipts received by the residents of Texas. In 1999 net earnings accounted for 79.0 percent of TPI (compared with 65.6 in 1989); dividends, interest, and rent were 12.0 percent (compared with 22.4 in 1989); and personal current transfer receipts were 9.0 percent (compared with 12.0 in 1989). From 1998 to 1999 net earnings increased 22.7 percent; dividends, interest, and rent decreased 6.2 percent; and personal current transfer receipts increased 4.2 percent. From 1989 to 1999 net earnings increased on average 11.2 percent each year; dividends, interest, and rent increased on average 2.6 percent; and personal current transfer receipts increased on average 6.1 percent.

EARNINGS BY PLACE OF WORK

Earnings of persons employed in Texas increased from \$388,990* in 1998 to \$476,085* in 1999, an increase of 22.4 percent. The 1998-1999 state change was 5.3 percent and the national change was 6.8 percent. The average annual growth rate from the 1989 estimate of \$151,786* to the 1999 estimate was 12.1 percent. The average annual growth rate for the state was 4.9 percent and for the nation was 5.6 percent.
