



## **BEARFACTS 1989 – 1999**

### **Northumberland , Pennsylvania [42097]**

Northumberland is one of 67 counties in Pennsylvania. It is part of the Sunbury, PA Micropolitan SA. Its 1999 population of 94,833 ranked 32nd in the state.

#### **PER CAPITA PERSONAL INCOME**

In 1999 Northumberland had a per capita personal income (PCPI) of \$21,523. This PCPI ranked 49th in the state and was 77 percent of the state average, \$27,937, and 77 percent of the national average, \$27,939. The 1999 PCPI reflected an increase of 3.0 percent from 1998. The 1998-1999 state change was 3.6 percent and the national change was 3.9 percent. In 1989 the PCPI of Northumberland was \$14,773 and ranked 43rd in the state. The 1989-1999 average annual growth rate of PCPI was 3.8 percent. The average annual growth rate for the state was 4.2 percent and for the nation was 4.2 percent.

#### **TOTAL PERSONAL INCOME**

In 1999 Northumberland had a total personal income (TPI) of \$2,041,049\*. This TPI ranked 33rd in the state and accounted for 0.6 percent of the state total. In 1989 the TPI of Northumberland was \$1,431,258\* and ranked 31st in the state. The 1999 TPI reflected an increase of 2.4 percent from 1998. The 1998-1999 state change was 3.8 percent and the national change was 5.1 percent. The 1989-1999 average annual growth rate of TPI was 3.6 percent. The average annual growth rate for the state was 4.5 percent and for the nation was 5.5 percent.

#### **COMPONENTS OF TOTAL PERSONAL INCOME**

Total personal income includes net earnings by place of residence; dividends, interest, and rent; and personal current transfer receipts received by the residents of Northumberland. In 1999 net earnings accounted for 60.4 percent of TPI (compared with 61.2 in 1989); dividends, interest, and rent were 17.8 percent (compared with 19.5 in 1989); and personal current transfer receipts were 21.8 percent (compared with 19.4 in 1989). From 1998 to 1999 net earnings increased 3.5 percent; dividends, interest, and rent decreased 2.7 percent; and personal current transfer receipts increased 3.7 percent. From 1989 to 1999 net earnings increased on average 3.5 percent each year; dividends, interest, and rent increased on average 2.7 percent; and personal current transfer receipts increased on average 4.9 percent.

#### **EARNINGS BY PLACE OF WORK**

Earnings of persons employed in Northumberland increased from \$1,077,023\* in 1998 to \$1,119,006\* in 1999, an increase of 3.9 percent. The 1998-1999 state change was 5.0 percent and the national change was 6.8 percent. The average annual growth rate from the 1989 estimate of \$836,234\* to the 1999 estimate was 3.0 percent. The average annual growth rate for the state was 4.6 percent and for the nation was 5.6 percent.
