



## **BEARFACTS 1989 – 1999**

### **Harding , South Dakota [46063]**

Harding is one of 66 counties in South Dakota. It is not part of a Metropolitan Area. Its 1999 population of 1,379 ranked 65th in the state.

#### **PER CAPITA PERSONAL INCOME**

In 1999 Harding had a per capita personal income (PCPI) of \$17,807. This PCPI ranked 57th in the state and was 73 percent of the state average, \$24,475, and 64 percent of the national average, \$27,939. The 1999 PCPI reflected an increase of 30.8 percent from 1998. The 1998-1999 state change was 4.2 percent and the national change was 3.9 percent. In 1989 the PCPI of Harding was \$12,532 and ranked 47th in the state. The 1989-1999 average annual growth rate of PCPI was 3.6 percent. The average annual growth rate for the state was 5.2 percent and for the nation was 4.2 percent.

#### **TOTAL PERSONAL INCOME**

In 1999 Harding had a total personal income (TPI) of \$24,556\*. This TPI ranked 66th in the state and accounted for 0.1 percent of the state total. In 1989 the TPI of Harding was \$21,141\* and ranked 63rd in the state. The 1999 TPI reflected an increase of 25.4 percent from 1998. The 1998-1999 state change was 4.8 percent and the national change was 5.1 percent. The 1989-1999 average annual growth rate of TPI was 1.5 percent. The average annual growth rate for the state was 6.0 percent and for the nation was 5.5 percent.

#### **COMPONENTS OF TOTAL PERSONAL INCOME**

Total personal income includes net earnings by place of residence; dividends, interest, and rent; and personal current transfer receipts received by the residents of Harding. In 1999 net earnings accounted for 49.5 percent of TPI (compared with 42.7 in 1989); dividends, interest, and rent were 37.4 percent (compared with 46.2 in 1989); and personal current transfer receipts were 13.0 percent (compared with 11.2 in 1989). From 1998 to 1999 net earnings increased 61.3 percent; dividends, interest, and rent increased 3.7 percent; and personal current transfer receipts increased 0.6 percent. From 1989 to 1999 net earnings increased on average 3.0 percent each year; dividends, interest, and rent decreased on average 0.6 percent; and personal current transfer receipts increased on average 3.1 percent.

#### **EARNINGS BY PLACE OF WORK**

Earnings of persons employed in Harding increased from \$9,123\* in 1998 to \$13,736\* in 1999, an increase of 50.6 percent. The 1998-1999 state change was 5.5 percent and the national change was 6.8 percent. The average annual growth rate from the 1989 estimate of \$10,316\* to the 1999 estimate was 2.9 percent. The average annual growth rate for the state was 6.4 percent and for the nation was 5.6 percent.
