



BEARFACTS 1989 – 1999

Baylor , Texas [48023]

Baylor is one of 254 counties in Texas. It is not part of a Metropolitan Area. Its 1999 population of 4,112 ranked 213th in the state.

PER CAPITA PERSONAL INCOME

In 1999 Baylor had a per capita personal income (PCPI) of \$19,886. This PCPI ranked 147th in the state and was 76 percent of the state average, \$26,250, and 71 percent of the national average, \$27,939. The 1999 PCPI reflected an increase of 0.6 percent from 1998. The 1998-1999 state change was 4.2 percent and the national change was 3.9 percent. In 1989 the PCPI of Baylor was \$14,416 and ranked 84th in the state. The 1989-1999 average annual growth rate of PCPI was 3.3 percent. The average annual growth rate for the state was 4.9 percent and for the nation was 4.2 percent.

TOTAL PERSONAL INCOME

In 1999 Baylor had a total personal income (TPI) of \$81,772*. This TPI ranked 211th in the state and accounted for 0.0 percent of the state total. In 1989 the TPI of Baylor was \$64,325* and ranked 203rd in the state. The 1999 TPI reflected a decrease of 1.2 percent from 1998. The 1998-1999 state change was 6.3 percent and the national change was 5.1 percent. The 1989-1999 average annual growth rate of TPI was 2.4 percent. The average annual growth rate for the state was 7.0 percent and for the nation was 5.5 percent.

COMPONENTS OF TOTAL PERSONAL INCOME

Total personal income includes net earnings by place of residence; dividends, interest, and rent; and personal current transfer receipts received by the residents of Baylor. In 1999 net earnings accounted for 49.1 percent of TPI (compared with 47.3 in 1989); dividends, interest, and rent were 23.1 percent (compared with 30.4 in 1989); and personal current transfer receipts were 27.8 percent (compared with 22.3 in 1989). From 1998 to 1999 net earnings decreased 3.2 percent; dividends, interest, and rent increased 3.2 percent; and personal current transfer receipts decreased 1.0 percent. From 1989 to 1999 net earnings increased on average 2.8 percent each year; dividends, interest, and rent decreased on average 0.4 percent; and personal current transfer receipts increased on average 4.7 percent.

EARNINGS BY PLACE OF WORK

Earnings of persons employed in Baylor decreased from \$41,630* in 1998 to \$39,631* in 1999, a decrease of 4.8 percent. The 1998-1999 state change was 7.9 percent and the national change was 6.8 percent. The average annual growth rate from the 1989 estimate of \$33,035* to the 1999 estimate was 1.8 percent. The average annual growth rate for the state was 7.5 percent and for the nation was 5.6 percent.
