



## **BEARFACTS 1990 – 2000**

### **Delta , Colorado [08029]**

Delta is one of 63 counties in Colorado. It is not part of a Metropolitan Area. Its 2000 population of 27,914 ranked 17th in the state.

#### **PER CAPITA PERSONAL INCOME**

In 2000 Delta had a per capita personal income (PCPI) of \$20,878. This PCPI ranked 49th in the state and was 63 percent of the state average, \$33,364, and 70 percent of the national average, \$29,847. The 2000 PCPI reflected an increase of 8.1 percent from 1999. The 1999-2000 state change was 9.4 percent and the national change was 6.8 percent. In 1990 the PCPI of Delta was \$12,843 and ranked 56th in the state. The 1990-2000 average annual growth rate of PCPI was 5.0 percent. The average annual growth rate for the state was 5.5 percent and for the nation was 4.4 percent.

#### **TOTAL PERSONAL INCOME**

In 2000 Delta had a total personal income (TPI) of \$582,778\*. This TPI ranked 23rd in the state and accounted for 0.4 percent of the state total. In 1990 the TPI of Delta was \$270,380\* and ranked 23rd in the state. The 2000 TPI reflected an increase of 9.4 percent from 1999. The 1999-2000 state change was 12.1 percent and the national change was 8.0 percent. The 1990-2000 average annual growth rate of TPI was 8.0 percent. The average annual growth rate for the state was 8.4 percent and for the nation was 5.6 percent.

#### **COMPONENTS OF TOTAL PERSONAL INCOME**

Total personal income includes net earnings by place of residence; dividends, interest, and rent; and personal current transfer receipts received by the residents of Delta. In 2000 net earnings accounted for 52.5 percent of TPI (compared with 47.2 in 1990); dividends, interest, and rent were 25.7 percent (compared with 28.8 in 1990); and personal current transfer receipts were 21.9 percent (compared with 24.0 in 1990). From 1999 to 2000 net earnings increased 12.2 percent; dividends, interest, and rent increased 7.3 percent; and personal current transfer receipts increased 5.7 percent. From 1990 to 2000 net earnings increased on average 9.1 percent each year; dividends, interest, and rent increased on average 6.7 percent; and personal current transfer receipts increased on average 7.0 percent.

#### **EARNINGS BY PLACE OF WORK**

Earnings of persons employed in Delta increased from \$245,074\* in 1999 to \$272,261\* in 2000, an increase of 11.1 percent. The 1999-2000 state change was 12.7 percent and the national change was 8.0 percent. The average annual growth rate from the 1990 estimate of \$125,003\* to the 2000 estimate was 8.1 percent. The average annual growth rate for the state was 8.8 percent and for the nation was 5.8 percent.
