



BEARFACTS 1990 – 2000

Casey , Kentucky [21045]

Casey is one of 120 counties in Kentucky. It is not part of a Metropolitan Area. Its 2000 population of 15,481 ranked 72nd in the state.

PER CAPITA PERSONAL INCOME

In 2000 Casey had a per capita personal income (PCPI) of \$17,419. This PCPI ranked 87th in the state and was 71 percent of the state average, \$24,413, and 58 percent of the national average, \$29,847. The 2000 PCPI reflected an increase of 11.1 percent from 1999. The 1999-2000 state change was 7.2 percent and the national change was 6.8 percent. In 1990 the PCPI of Casey was \$10,488 and ranked 97th in the state. The 1990-2000 average annual growth rate of PCPI was 5.2 percent. The average annual growth rate for the state was 4.7 percent and for the nation was 4.4 percent.

TOTAL PERSONAL INCOME

In 2000 Casey had a total personal income (TPI) of \$269,671*. This TPI ranked 75th in the state and accounted for 0.3 percent of the state total. In 1990 the TPI of Casey was \$148,862* and ranked 78th in the state. The 2000 TPI reflected an increase of 12.3 percent from 1999. The 1999-2000 state change was 8.1 percent and the national change was 8.0 percent. The 1990-2000 average annual growth rate of TPI was 6.1 percent. The average annual growth rate for the state was 5.7 percent and for the nation was 5.6 percent.

COMPONENTS OF TOTAL PERSONAL INCOME

Total personal income includes net earnings by place of residence; dividends, interest, and rent; and personal current transfer receipts received by the residents of Casey. In 2000 net earnings accounted for 59.6 percent of TPI (compared with 63.1 in 1990); dividends, interest, and rent were 14.0 percent (compared with 13.6 in 1990); and personal current transfer receipts were 26.4 percent (compared with 23.3 in 1990). From 1999 to 2000 net earnings increased 13.4 percent; dividends, interest, and rent increased 14.1 percent; and personal current transfer receipts increased 9.1 percent. From 1990 to 2000 net earnings increased on average 5.5 percent each year; dividends, interest, and rent increased on average 6.5 percent; and personal current transfer receipts increased on average 7.5 percent.

EARNINGS BY PLACE OF WORK

Earnings of persons employed in Casey increased from \$107,870* in 1999 to \$124,577* in 2000, an increase of 15.5 percent. The 1999-2000 state change was 7.0 percent and the national change was 8.0 percent. The average annual growth rate from the 1990 estimate of \$76,843* to the 2000 estimate was 5.0 percent. The average annual growth rate for the state was 5.7 percent and for the nation was 5.8 percent.
