



## **BEARFACTS 1990 – 2000**

### **Hill , Montana [30041]**

Hill is one of 56 counties in Montana. It is part of the Havre, MT Micropolitan SA. Its 2000 population of 16,628 ranked 11th in the state.

#### **PER CAPITA PERSONAL INCOME**

In 2000 Hill had a per capita personal income (PCPI) of \$22,414. This PCPI ranked 14th in the state and was 98 percent of the state average, \$22,934, and 75 percent of the national average, \$29,847. The 2000 PCPI reflected an increase of 5.4 percent from 1999. The 1999-2000 state change was 6.2 percent and the national change was 6.8 percent. In 1990 the PCPI of Hill was \$16,007 and ranked 12th in the state. The 1990-2000 average annual growth rate of PCPI was 3.4 percent. The average annual growth rate for the state was 4.0 percent and for the nation was 4.4 percent.

#### **TOTAL PERSONAL INCOME**

In 2000 Hill had a total personal income (TPI) of \$372,705\*. This TPI ranked 10th in the state and accounted for 1.8 percent of the state total. In 1990 the TPI of Hill was \$282,797\* and ranked 9th in the state. The 2000 TPI reflected an increase of 4.2 percent from 1999. The 1999-2000 state change was 6.9 percent and the national change was 8.0 percent. The 1990-2000 average annual growth rate of TPI was 2.8 percent. The average annual growth rate for the state was 5.3 percent and for the nation was 5.6 percent.

#### **COMPONENTS OF TOTAL PERSONAL INCOME**

Total personal income includes net earnings by place of residence; dividends, interest, and rent; and personal current transfer receipts received by the residents of Hill. In 2000 net earnings accounted for 57.5 percent of TPI (compared with 61.9 in 1990); dividends, interest, and rent were 23.1 percent (compared with 21.3 in 1990); and personal current transfer receipts were 19.4 percent (compared with 16.8 in 1990). From 1999 to 2000 net earnings increased 1.8 percent; dividends, interest, and rent increased 5.4 percent; and personal current transfer receipts increased 10.5 percent. From 1990 to 2000 net earnings increased on average 2.0 percent each year; dividends, interest, and rent increased on average 3.6 percent; and personal current transfer receipts increased on average 4.3 percent.

#### **EARNINGS BY PLACE OF WORK**

Earnings of persons employed in Hill increased from \$246,209\* in 1999 to \$250,798\* in 2000, an increase of 1.9 percent. The 1999-2000 state change was 5.6 percent and the national change was 8.0 percent. The average annual growth rate from the 1990 estimate of \$205,290\* to the 2000 estimate was 2.0 percent. The average annual growth rate for the state was 5.4 percent and for the nation was 5.8 percent.
