



BEARFACTS 1990 – 2000

Grant , Nebraska [31075]

Grant is one of 93 counties in Nebraska. It is not part of a Metropolitan Area. Its 2000 population of 746 ranked 88th in the state.

PER CAPITA PERSONAL INCOME

In 2000 Grant had a per capita personal income (PCPI) of \$9,682. This PCPI ranked 90th in the state and was 35 percent of the state average, \$27,626, and 32 percent of the national average, \$29,847. The 2000 PCPI reflected a decrease of 27.9 percent from 1999. The 1999-2000 state change was 4.4 percent and the national change was 6.8 percent. In 1990 the PCPI of Grant was \$13,034 and ranked 86th in the state. The 1990-2000 average annual growth rate of PCPI was - 2.9 percent. The average annual growth rate for the state was 4.4 percent and for the nation was 4.4 percent.

TOTAL PERSONAL INCOME

In 2000 Grant had a total personal income (TPI) of \$7,223^{*}. This TPI ranked 89th in the state and accounted for 0.0 percent of the state total. In 1990 the TPI of Grant was \$9,893^{*} and ranked 89th in the state. The 2000 TPI reflected a decrease of 28.1 percent from 1999. The 1999-2000 state change was 4.9 percent and the national change was 8.0 percent. The 1990-2000 average annual growth rate of TPI was - 3.1 percent. The average annual growth rate for the state was 5.2 percent and for the nation was 5.6 percent.

COMPONENTS OF TOTAL PERSONAL INCOME

Total personal income includes net earnings by place of residence; dividends, interest, and rent; and personal current transfer receipts received by the residents of Grant. From 1999 to 2000 dividends, interest, and rent increased 4.4 percent; and personal current transfer receipts increased 10.6 percent. From 1990 to 2000 net earnings cannot be calculated; dividends, interest, and rent increased on average 3.7 percent; and personal current transfer receipts increased on average 5.3 percent.

EARNINGS BY PLACE OF WORK

Earnings of persons employed in Grant decreased from \$2,819^{*} in 1999 to \$- 444^{*} in 2000. The 1999-2000 state change was 3.8 percent and the national change was 8.0 percent. The average annual growth rate from the 1990 estimate of \$4,799^{*} to the 2000 estimate cannot be calculated. The average annual growth rate for the state was 5.1 percent and for the nation was 5.8 percent.

**Note: All income estimates with the exception of PCPI are in thousands of dollars, not adjusted for inflation.*

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
