



BEARFACTS 1990 – 2000

New York [36000]

The population of New York in 2000 was 18,998,429. Its rank was 3rd in the nation.

PER CAPITA PERSONAL INCOME

In 2000 New York had a per capita personal income (PCPI) of \$34,898. This PCPI ranked 4th in the United States and was 117 percent of the national average, \$29,847. The 2000 PCPI reflected an increase of 6.3 percent from 1999. The 1999-2000 national change was 6.8 percent. In 1990 the PCPI of New York was \$23,523 and ranked 3rd in the United States. The 1990-2000 average annual growth rate of PCPI was 4.0 percent. The average annual growth rate for the nation was 4.4 percent.

TOTAL PERSONAL INCOME

In 2000 New York had a total personal income (TPI) of \$663,005,163*. This TPI ranked 2nd in the United States. In 1990 the TPI of New York was \$423,896,642* and ranked 2nd in the United States. The 2000 TPI reflected an increase of 7.0 percent from 1999. The 1999-2000 national change was 8.0 percent. The 1990-2000 average annual growth rate of TPI was 4.6 percent. The average annual growth rate for the nation was 5.6 percent.

COMPONENTS OF TOTAL PERSONAL INCOME

Total personal income includes net earnings by place of residence; dividends, interest, and rent; and personal current transfer receipts received by the residents of New York. In 2000 net earnings accounted for 67.4 percent of TPI (compared with 66.4 in 1990); dividends, interest, and rent were 17.5 percent (compared with 19.9 in 1990); and personal current transfer receipts were 15.1 percent (compared with 13.7 in 1990). From 1999 to 2000 net earnings increased 7.6 percent; dividends, interest, and rent increased 6.9 percent; and personal current transfer receipts increased 4.6 percent. From 1990 to 2000 net earnings increased on average 4.7 percent each year; dividends, interest, and rent increased on average 3.2 percent; and personal current transfer receipts increased on average 5.6 percent.

EARNINGS BY PLACE OF WORK

Earnings of persons employed in New York increased from \$499,459,141* in 1999 to \$538,622,543* in 2000, an increase of 7.8 percent. The 1999-2000 national change was 8.0 percent. The average annual growth rate from the 1990 estimate of \$333,212,080* to the 2000 estimate was 4.9 percent. The average annual growth rate for the nation was 5.8 percent.
