



BEARFACTS 1990 – 2000

Granville , North Carolina [37077]

Granville is one of 100 counties in North Carolina. It is not part of a Metropolitan Area. Its 2000 population of 48,836 ranked 50th in the state.

PER CAPITA PERSONAL INCOME

In 2000 Granville had a per capita personal income (PCPI) of \$22,315. This PCPI ranked 59th in the state and was 82 percent of the state average, \$27,067, and 75 percent of the national average, \$29,847. The 2000 PCPI reflected an increase of 6.6 percent from 1999. The 1999-2000 state change was 5.9 percent and the national change was 6.8 percent. In 1990 the PCPI of Granville was \$13,946 and ranked 64th in the state. The 1990-2000 average annual growth rate of PCPI was 4.8 percent. The average annual growth rate for the state was 4.6 percent and for the nation was 4.4 percent.

TOTAL PERSONAL INCOME

In 2000 Granville had a total personal income (TPI) of \$1,089,755*. This TPI ranked 50th in the state and accounted for 0.5 percent of the state total. In 1990 the TPI of Granville was \$536,438* and ranked 54th in the state. The 2000 TPI reflected an increase of 9.6 percent from 1999. The 1999-2000 state change was 7.6 percent and the national change was 8.0 percent. The 1990-2000 average annual growth rate of TPI was 7.3 percent. The average annual growth rate for the state was 6.6 percent and for the nation was 5.6 percent.

COMPONENTS OF TOTAL PERSONAL INCOME

Total personal income includes net earnings by place of residence; dividends, interest, and rent; and personal current transfer receipts received by the residents of Granville. In 2000 net earnings accounted for 67.8 percent of TPI (compared with 69.1 in 1990); dividends, interest, and rent were 16.5 percent (compared with 17.2 in 1990); and personal current transfer receipts were 15.7 percent (compared with 13.7 in 1990). From 1999 to 2000 net earnings increased 10.3 percent; dividends, interest, and rent increased 6.4 percent; and personal current transfer receipts increased 10.1 percent. From 1990 to 2000 net earnings increased on average 7.1 percent each year; dividends, interest, and rent increased on average 6.9 percent; and personal current transfer receipts increased on average 8.8 percent.

EARNINGS BY PLACE OF WORK

Earnings of persons employed in Granville increased from \$693,858* in 1999 to \$751,092* in 2000, an increase of 8.2 percent. The 1999-2000 state change was 7.4 percent and the national change was 8.0 percent. The average annual growth rate from the 1990 estimate of \$405,621* to the 2000 estimate was 6.4 percent. The average annual growth rate for the state was 6.5 percent and for the nation was 5.8 percent.
