



## **BEARFACTS 1990 – 2000**

### **Billings , North Dakota [38007]**

Billings is one of 53 counties in North Dakota. It is part of the Dickinson, ND Micropolitan SA. Its 2000 population of 877 ranked 52nd in the state.

#### **PER CAPITA PERSONAL INCOME**

In 2000 Billings had a per capita personal income (PCPI) of \$18,227. This PCPI ranked 50th in the state and was 73 percent of the state average, \$25,105, and 61 percent of the national average, \$29,847. The 2000 PCPI reflected an increase of 10.5 percent from 1999. The 1999-2000 state change was 8.3 percent and the national change was 6.8 percent. In 1990 the PCPI of Billings was \$12,020 and ranked 47th in the state. The 1990-2000 average annual growth rate of PCPI was 4.3 percent. The average annual growth rate for the state was 4.6 percent and for the nation was 4.4 percent.

#### **TOTAL PERSONAL INCOME**

In 2000 Billings had a total personal income (TPI) of \$15,985\*. This TPI ranked 53rd in the state and accounted for 0.1 percent of the state total. In 1990 the TPI of Billings was \$13,102\* and ranked 52nd in the state. The 2000 TPI reflected an increase of 4.5 percent from 1999. The 1999-2000 state change was 7.8 percent and the national change was 8.0 percent. The 1990-2000 average annual growth rate of TPI was 2.0 percent. The average annual growth rate for the state was 4.7 percent and for the nation was 5.6 percent.

#### **COMPONENTS OF TOTAL PERSONAL INCOME**

Total personal income includes net earnings by place of residence; dividends, interest, and rent; and personal current transfer receipts received by the residents of Billings. In 2000 net earnings accounted for 52.8 percent of TPI (compared with 61.8 in 1990); dividends, interest, and rent were 34.6 percent (compared with 28.1 in 1990); and personal current transfer receipts were 12.6 percent (compared with 10.1 in 1990). From 1999 to 2000 net earnings decreased 0.5 percent; dividends, interest, and rent increased 13.7 percent; and personal current transfer receipts increased 3.6 percent. From 1990 to 2000 net earnings increased on average 0.4 percent each year; dividends, interest, and rent increased on average 4.2 percent; and personal current transfer receipts increased on average 4.3 percent.

#### **EARNINGS BY PLACE OF WORK**

Earnings of persons employed in Billings increased from \$11,119\* in 1999 to \$11,141\* in 2000, an increase of 0.2 percent. The 1999-2000 state change was 7.2 percent and the national change was 8.0 percent. The average annual growth rate from the 1990 estimate of \$15,392\* to the 2000 estimate was - 3.2 percent. The average annual growth rate for the state was 5.1 percent and for the nation was 5.8 percent.

*\*Note: All income estimates with the exception of PCPI are in thousands of dollars, not adjusted for inflation.*
