



## **BEARFACTS 1990 – 2000**

### **Woodward , Oklahoma [40153]**

Woodward is one of 77 counties in Oklahoma. It is part of the Woodward, OK Micropolitan SA. Its 2000 population of 18,429 ranked 42nd in the state.

#### **PER CAPITA PERSONAL INCOME**

In 2000 Woodward had a per capita personal income (PCPI) of \$19,888. This PCPI ranked 44th in the state and was 81 percent of the state average, \$24,410, and 67 percent of the national average, \$29,847. The 2000 PCPI reflected an increase of 9.1 percent from 1999. The 1999-2000 state change was 8.2 percent and the national change was 6.8 percent. In 1990 the PCPI of Woodward was \$13,851 and ranked 36th in the state. The 1990-2000 average annual growth rate of PCPI was 3.7 percent. The average annual growth rate for the state was 4.2 percent and for the nation was 4.4 percent.

#### **TOTAL PERSONAL INCOME**

In 2000 Woodward had a total personal income (TPI) of \$366,513\*. This TPI ranked 39th in the state and accounted for 0.4 percent of the state total. In 1990 the TPI of Woodward was \$262,496\* and ranked 38th in the state. The 2000 TPI reflected an increase of 7.8 percent from 1999. The 1999-2000 state change was 8.7 percent and the national change was 8.0 percent. The 1990-2000 average annual growth rate of TPI was 3.4 percent. The average annual growth rate for the state was 5.2 percent and for the nation was 5.6 percent.

#### **COMPONENTS OF TOTAL PERSONAL INCOME**

Total personal income includes net earnings by place of residence; dividends, interest, and rent; and personal current transfer receipts received by the residents of Woodward. In 2000 net earnings accounted for 61.5 percent of TPI (compared with 63.3 in 1990); dividends, interest, and rent were 20.9 percent (compared with 22.3 in 1990); and personal current transfer receipts were 17.6 percent (compared with 14.3 in 1990). From 1999 to 2000 net earnings increased 6.9 percent; dividends, interest, and rent increased 13.6 percent; and personal current transfer receipts increased 4.3 percent. From 1990 to 2000 net earnings increased on average 3.1 percent each year; dividends, interest, and rent increased on average 2.7 percent; and personal current transfer receipts increased on average 5.6 percent.

#### **EARNINGS BY PLACE OF WORK**

Earnings of persons employed in Woodward increased from \$252,537\* in 1999 to \$269,909\* in 2000, an increase of 6.9 percent. The 1999-2000 state change was 7.8 percent and the national change was 8.0 percent. The average annual growth rate from the 1990 estimate of \$197,933\* to the 2000 estimate was 3.2 percent. The average annual growth rate for the state was 5.1 percent and for the nation was 5.8 percent.
