



## **BEARFACTS 1990 – 2000**

### **Jones , South Dakota [46075]**

Jones is one of 66 counties in South Dakota. It is not part of a Metropolitan Area. Its 2000 population of 1,184 ranked 66th in the state.

#### **PER CAPITA PERSONAL INCOME**

In 2000 Jones had a per capita personal income (PCPI) of \$25,181. This PCPI ranked 27th in the state and was 98 percent of the state average, \$25,723, and 84 percent of the national average, \$29,847. The 2000 PCPI reflected a decrease of 3.9 percent from 1999. The 1999-2000 state change was 5.1 percent and the national change was 6.8 percent. In 1990 the PCPI of Jones was \$19,815 and ranked 3rd in the state. The 1990-2000 average annual growth rate of PCPI was 2.4 percent. The average annual growth rate for the state was 4.8 percent and for the nation was 4.4 percent.

#### **TOTAL PERSONAL INCOME**

In 2000 Jones had a total personal income (TPI) of \$29,814\*. This TPI ranked 63rd in the state and accounted for 0.2 percent of the state total. In 1990 the TPI of Jones was \$26,314\* and ranked 61st in the state. The 2000 TPI reflected a decrease of 6.2 percent from 1999. The 1999-2000 state change was 5.8 percent and the national change was 8.0 percent. The 1990-2000 average annual growth rate of TPI was 1.3 percent. The average annual growth rate for the state was 5.6 percent and for the nation was 5.6 percent.

#### **COMPONENTS OF TOTAL PERSONAL INCOME**

Total personal income includes net earnings by place of residence; dividends, interest, and rent; and personal current transfer receipts received by the residents of Jones. In 2000 net earnings accounted for 63.0 percent of TPI (compared with 64.9 in 1990); dividends, interest, and rent were 24.4 percent (compared with 24.5 in 1990); and personal current transfer receipts were 12.6 percent (compared with 10.6 in 1990). From 1999 to 2000 net earnings decreased 10.5 percent; dividends, interest, and rent increased 2.1 percent; and personal current transfer receipts increased 1.9 percent. From 1990 to 2000 net earnings increased on average 1.0 percent each year; dividends, interest, and rent increased on average 1.2 percent; and personal current transfer receipts increased on average 3.1 percent.

#### **EARNINGS BY PLACE OF WORK**

Earnings of persons employed in Jones decreased from \$22,317\* in 1999 to \$20,072\* in 2000, a decrease of 10.1 percent. The 1999-2000 state change was 5.3 percent and the national change was 8.0 percent. The average annual growth rate from the 1990 estimate of \$18,140\* to the 2000 estimate was 1.0 percent. The average annual growth rate for the state was 5.8 percent and for the nation was 5.8 percent.
