



## **BEARFACTS 1990 – 2000**

### **Tyler (MSA) [46340]**

Tyler is one of 363 Metropolitan Statistical Areas (MSAs) in the nation. Its 2000 population of 175,495 ranked 212th in the nation.

#### **PER CAPITA PERSONAL INCOME**

In 2000 Tyler had a per capita personal income (PCPI) of \$28,047. This PCPI ranked 117th in the United States and was 94 percent of the national average, \$29,847. The 2000 PCPI reflected an increase of 9.8 percent from 1999. The 1999-2000 national change was 6.8 percent. In 1990 the PCPI of Tyler was \$17,253 and ranked 166th in the United States. The 1990-2000 average annual growth rate of PCPI was 5.0 percent. The average annual growth rate for the nation was 4.4 percent.

#### **TOTAL PERSONAL INCOME**

In 2000 Tyler had a total personal income (TPI) of \$4,922,045\*. This TPI ranked 194th in the United States. In 1990 the TPI of Tyler was \$2,614,712\* and ranked 205th in the United States. The 2000 TPI reflected an increase of 11.5 percent from 1999. The 1999-2000 national change was 8.0 percent. The 1990-2000 average annual growth rate of TPI was 6.5 percent. The average annual growth rate for the nation was 5.6 percent.

#### **COMPONENTS OF TOTAL PERSONAL INCOME**

Total personal income includes net earnings by place of residence; dividends, interest, and rent; and personal current transfer receipts received by the residents of Tyler. In 2000 net earnings accounted for 65.6 percent of TPI (compared with 62.8 in 1990); dividends, interest, and rent were 20.4 percent (compared with 23.9 in 1990); and personal current transfer receipts were 13.9 percent (compared with 13.3 in 1990). From 1999 to 2000 net earnings increased 12.3 percent; dividends, interest, and rent increased 12.6 percent; and personal current transfer receipts increased 6.8 percent. From 1990 to 2000 net earnings increased on average 7.0 percent each year; dividends, interest, and rent increased on average 4.9 percent; and personal current transfer receipts increased on average 7.0 percent.

#### **EARNINGS BY PLACE OF WORK**

Earnings of persons employed in Tyler increased from \$3,445,364\* in 1999 to \$3,847,208\* in 2000, an increase of 11.7 percent. The 1999-2000 national change was 8.0 percent. The average annual growth rate from the 1990 estimate of \$1,914,664\* to the 2000 estimate was 7.2 percent. The average annual growth rate for the nation was 5.8 percent.

*\*Note: All income estimates with the exception of PCPI are in thousands of dollars, not adjusted for inflation.*
