



## **BEARFACTS 1990 – 2000**

### **Hunt , Texas [48231]**

Hunt is one of 254 counties in Texas. It is part of the [Dallas-Fort Worth-Arlington, TX \(MSA\)](#). Its 2000 population of 76,930 ranked 43rd in the state.

#### **PER CAPITA PERSONAL INCOME**

In 2000 Hunt had a per capita personal income (PCPI) of \$22,958. This PCPI ranked 84th in the state and was 81 percent of the state average, \$28,317, and 77 percent of the national average, \$29,847. The 2000 PCPI reflected an increase of 6.1 percent from 1999. The 1999-2000 state change was 7.9 percent and the national change was 6.8 percent. In 1990 the PCPI of Hunt was \$15,161 and ranked 102nd in the state. The 1990-2000 average annual growth rate of PCPI was 4.2 percent. The average annual growth rate for the state was 5.0 percent and for the nation was 4.4 percent.

#### **TOTAL PERSONAL INCOME**

In 2000 Hunt had a total personal income (TPI) of \$1,766,194\*. This TPI ranked 44th in the state and accounted for 0.3 percent of the state total. In 1990 the TPI of Hunt was \$976,210\* and ranked 40th in the state. The 2000 TPI reflected an increase of 8.7 percent from 1999. The 1999-2000 state change was 9.9 percent and the national change was 8.0 percent. The 1990-2000 average annual growth rate of TPI was 6.1 percent. The average annual growth rate for the state was 7.2 percent and for the nation was 5.6 percent.

#### **COMPONENTS OF TOTAL PERSONAL INCOME**

Total personal income includes net earnings by place of residence; dividends, interest, and rent; and personal current transfer receipts received by the residents of Hunt. In 2000 net earnings accounted for 70.4 percent of TPI (compared with 67.7 in 1990); dividends, interest, and rent were 13.4 percent (compared with 16.6 in 1990); and personal current transfer receipts were 16.2 percent (compared with 15.7 in 1990). From 1999 to 2000 net earnings increased 8.9 percent; dividends, interest, and rent increased 10.6 percent; and personal current transfer receipts increased 6.2 percent. From 1990 to 2000 net earnings increased on average 6.5 percent each year; dividends, interest, and rent increased on average 3.8 percent; and personal current transfer receipts increased on average 6.5 percent.

#### **EARNINGS BY PLACE OF WORK**

Earnings of persons employed in Hunt increased from \$953,178\* in 1999 to \$1,000,691\* in 2000, an increase of 5.0 percent. The 1999-2000 state change was 9.9 percent and the national change was 8.0 percent. The average annual growth rate from the 1990 estimate of \$684,005\* to the 2000 estimate was 3.9 percent. The average annual growth rate for the state was 7.6 percent and for the nation was 5.8 percent.
