



BEARFACTS 1990 – 2000

Motley , Texas [48345]

Motley is one of 254 counties in Texas. It is not part of a Metropolitan Area. Its 2000 population of 1,442 ranked 244th in the state.

PER CAPITA PERSONAL INCOME

In 2000 Motley had a per capita personal income (PCPI) of \$16,402. This PCPI ranked 225th in the state and was 58 percent of the state average, \$28,317, and 55 percent of the national average, \$29,847. The 2000 PCPI reflected a decrease of 13.6 percent from 1999. The 1999-2000 state change was 7.9 percent and the national change was 6.8 percent. In 1990 the PCPI of Motley was \$15,611 and ranked 84th in the state. The 1990-2000 average annual growth rate of PCPI was 0.5 percent. The average annual growth rate for the state was 5.0 percent and for the nation was 4.4 percent.

TOTAL PERSONAL INCOME

In 2000 Motley had a total personal income (TPI) of \$23,651*. This TPI ranked 246th in the state and accounted for 0.0 percent of the state total. In 1990 the TPI of Motley was \$23,650* and ranked 245th in the state. The 2000 TPI reflected a decrease of 10.5 percent from 1999. The 1999-2000 state change was 9.9 percent and the national change was 8.0 percent. The 1990-2000 average annual growth rate of TPI was 0.0 percent. The average annual growth rate for the state was 7.2 percent and for the nation was 5.6 percent.

COMPONENTS OF TOTAL PERSONAL INCOME

Total personal income includes net earnings by place of residence; dividends, interest, and rent; and personal current transfer receipts received by the residents of Motley. In 2000 net earnings accounted for 45.8 percent of TPI (compared with 57.4 in 1990); dividends, interest, and rent were 26.8 percent (compared with 22.2 in 1990); and personal current transfer receipts were 27.4 percent (compared with 20.3 in 1990). From 1999 to 2000 net earnings decreased 25.1 percent; dividends, interest, and rent increased 13.0 percent; and personal current transfer receipts increased 2.1 percent. From 1990 to 2000 net earnings decreased on average 2.2 percent each year; dividends, interest, and rent increased on average 1.9 percent; and personal current transfer receipts increased on average 3.0 percent.

EARNINGS BY PLACE OF WORK

Earnings of persons employed in Motley decreased from \$13,175* in 1999 to \$9,181* in 2000, a decrease of 30.3 percent. The 1999-2000 state change was 9.9 percent and the national change was 8.0 percent. The average annual growth rate from the 1990 estimate of \$14,202* to the 2000 estimate was - 4.3 percent. The average annual growth rate for the state was 7.6 percent and for the nation was 5.8 percent.
