



BEARFACTS 1990 – 2000

Teton , Wyoming [56039]

Teton is one of 23 counties in Wyoming. It is part of the Jackson, WY-ID Micropolitan SA. Its 2000 population of 18,365 ranked 10th in the state.

PER CAPITA PERSONAL INCOME

In 2000 Teton had a per capita personal income (PCPI) of \$62,807. This PCPI ranked 1st in the state and was 221 percent of the state average, \$28,470, and 210 percent of the national average, \$29,847. The 2000 PCPI reflected an increase of 5.5 percent from 1999. The 1999-2000 state change was 7.3 percent and the national change was 6.8 percent. In 1990 the PCPI of Teton was \$35,318 and ranked 1st in the state. The 1990-2000 average annual growth rate of PCPI was 5.9 percent. The average annual growth rate for the state was 4.7 percent and for the nation was 4.4 percent.

TOTAL PERSONAL INCOME

In 2000 Teton had a total personal income (TPI) of \$1,153,458*. This TPI ranked 3rd in the state and accounted for 8.2 percent of the state total. In 1990 the TPI of Teton was \$400,084* and ranked 8th in the state. The 2000 TPI reflected an increase of 9.6 percent from 1999. The 1999-2000 state change was 7.8 percent and the national change was 8.0 percent. The 1990-2000 average annual growth rate of TPI was 11.2 percent. The average annual growth rate for the state was 5.6 percent and for the nation was 5.6 percent.

COMPONENTS OF TOTAL PERSONAL INCOME

Total personal income includes net earnings by place of residence; dividends, interest, and rent; and personal current transfer receipts received by the residents of Teton. In 2000 net earnings accounted for 45.6 percent of TPI (compared with 59.8 in 1990); dividends, interest, and rent were 51.1 percent (compared with 35.9 in 1990); and personal current transfer receipts were 3.3 percent (compared with 4.2 in 1990). From 1999 to 2000 net earnings increased 2.6 percent; dividends, interest, and rent increased 17.0 percent; and personal current transfer receipts increased 7.0 percent. From 1990 to 2000 net earnings increased on average 8.2 percent each year; dividends, interest, and rent increased on average 15.1 percent; and personal current transfer receipts increased on average 8.3 percent.

EARNINGS BY PLACE OF WORK

Earnings of persons employed in Teton increased from \$647,101* in 1999 to \$670,845* in 2000, an increase of 3.7 percent. The 1999-2000 state change was 7.4 percent and the national change was 8.0 percent. The average annual growth rate from the 1990 estimate of \$286,461* to the 2000 estimate was 8.9 percent. The average annual growth rate for the state was 4.8 percent and for the nation was 5.8 percent.
