



BEARFACTS 1990 – 2000

Dallas-Fort Worth (BEA-EA) [57042]

Dallas-Fort Worth is one of 179 BEA Economic Areas in the nation. Its 2000 population of 6,712,260 ranked 9th in the nation.

PER CAPITA PERSONAL INCOME

In 2000 Dallas-Fort Worth had a per capita personal income (PCPI) of \$31,423. This PCPI ranked 16th in the United States and was 105 percent of the national average, \$29,847. The 2000 PCPI reflected an increase of 8.4 percent from 1999. The 1999-2000 national change was 6.8 percent. In 1990 the PCPI of Dallas-Fort Worth was \$19,284 and ranked 23rd in the United States. The 1990-2000 average annual growth rate of PCPI was 5.0 percent. The average annual growth rate for the nation was 4.4 percent.

TOTAL PERSONAL INCOME

In 2000 Dallas-Fort Worth had a total personal income (TPI) of \$210,919,965*. This TPI ranked 9th in the United States. In 1990 the TPI of Dallas-Fort Worth was \$103,104,309* and ranked 9th in the United States. The 2000 TPI reflected an increase of 11.0 percent from 1999. The 1999-2000 national change was 8.0 percent. The 1990-2000 average annual growth rate of TPI was 7.4 percent. The average annual growth rate for the nation was 5.6 percent.

COMPONENTS OF TOTAL PERSONAL INCOME

Total personal income includes net earnings by place of residence; dividends, interest, and rent; and personal current transfer receipts received by the residents of Dallas-Fort Worth. In 2000 net earnings accounted for 76.7 percent of TPI (compared with 73.0 in 1990); dividends, interest, and rent were 14.1 percent (compared with 17.7 in 1990); and personal current transfer receipts were 9.2 percent (compared with 9.3 in 1990). From 1999 to 2000 net earnings increased 11.4 percent; dividends, interest, and rent increased 11.6 percent; and personal current transfer receipts increased 6.8 percent. From 1990 to 2000 net earnings increased on average 8.0 percent each year; dividends, interest, and rent increased on average 5.1 percent; and personal current transfer receipts increased on average 7.2 percent.

EARNINGS BY PLACE OF WORK

Earnings of persons employed in Dallas-Fort Worth increased from \$161,892,449* in 1999 to \$179,797,373* in 2000, an increase of 11.1 percent. The 1999-2000 national change was 8.0 percent. The average annual growth rate from the 1990 estimate of \$83,770,584* to the 2000 estimate was 7.9 percent. The average annual growth rate for the nation was 5.8 percent.
