



BEARFACTS 1991 – 2001

Hot Spring , Arkansas [05059]

Hot Spring is one of 75 counties in Arkansas. It is not part of a Metropolitan Area. Its 2001 population of 30,331 ranked 22nd in the state.

PER CAPITA PERSONAL INCOME

In 2001 Hot Spring had a per capita personal income (PCPI) of \$19,186. This PCPI ranked 50th in the state and was 83 percent of the state average, \$23,039, and 63 percent of the national average, \$30,582. The 2001 PCPI reflected an increase of 4.6 percent from 2000. The 2000-2001 state change was 5.1 percent and the national change was 2.5 percent. In 1991 the PCPI of Hot Spring was \$12,541 and ranked 50th in the state. The 1991-2001 average annual growth rate of PCPI was 4.3 percent. The average annual growth rate for the state was 4.3 percent and for the nation was 4.4 percent.

TOTAL PERSONAL INCOME

In 2001 Hot Spring had a total personal income (TPI) of \$581,937*. This TPI ranked 23rd in the state and accounted for 0.9 percent of the state total. In 1991 the TPI of Hot Spring was \$329,321* and ranked 26th in the state. The 2001 TPI reflected an increase of 4.4 percent from 2000. The 2000-2001 state change was 5.5 percent and the national change was 3.5 percent. The 1991-2001 average annual growth rate of TPI was 5.9 percent. The average annual growth rate for the state was 5.6 percent and for the nation was 5.6 percent.

COMPONENTS OF TOTAL PERSONAL INCOME

Total personal income includes net earnings by place of residence; dividends, interest, and rent; and personal current transfer receipts received by the residents of Hot Spring. In 2001 net earnings accounted for 60.4 percent of TPI (compared with 59.6 in 1991); dividends, interest, and rent were 15.6 percent (compared with 17.0 in 1991); and personal current transfer receipts were 24.0 percent (compared with 23.3 in 1991). From 2000 to 2001 net earnings increased 2.5 percent; dividends, interest, and rent increased 3.2 percent; and personal current transfer receipts increased 10.4 percent. From 1991 to 2001 net earnings increased on average 6.0 percent each year; dividends, interest, and rent increased on average 4.9 percent; and personal current transfer receipts increased on average 6.2 percent.

EARNINGS BY PLACE OF WORK

Earnings of persons employed in Hot Spring decreased from \$273,650* in 2000 to \$271,793* in 2001, a decrease of 0.7 percent. The 2000-2001 state change was 5.1 percent and the national change was 3.1 percent. The average annual growth rate from the 1991 estimate of \$169,190* to the 2001 estimate was 4.9 percent. The average annual growth rate for the state was 5.6 percent and for the nation was 5.8 percent.
