



BEARFACTS 1991 – 2001

New Haven , Connecticut [09009]

New Haven is one of 8 counties in Connecticut. It is part of the [New Haven-Milford, CT \(MSA\)](#). Its 2001 population of 828,441 ranked 3rd in the state.

PER CAPITA PERSONAL INCOME

In 2001 New Haven had a per capita personal income (PCPI) of \$35,298. This PCPI ranked 5th in the state and was 82 percent of the state average, \$42,983, and 115 percent of the national average, \$30,582. The 2001 PCPI reflected an increase of 2.6 percent from 2000. The 2000-2001 state change was 3.6 percent and the national change was 2.5 percent. In 1991 the PCPI of New Haven was \$23,375 and ranked 5th in the state. The 1991-2001 average annual growth rate of PCPI was 4.2 percent. The average annual growth rate for the state was 5.0 percent and for the nation was 4.4 percent.

TOTAL PERSONAL INCOME

In 2001 New Haven had a total personal income (TPI) of \$29,242,501*. This TPI ranked 3rd in the state and accounted for 19.8 percent of the state total. In 1991 the TPI of New Haven was \$18,874,860* and ranked 3rd in the state. The 2001 TPI reflected an increase of 3.0 percent from 2000. The 2000-2001 state change was 4.1 percent and the national change was 3.5 percent. The 1991-2001 average annual growth rate of TPI was 4.5 percent. The average annual growth rate for the state was 5.3 percent and for the nation was 5.6 percent.

COMPONENTS OF TOTAL PERSONAL INCOME

Total personal income includes net earnings by place of residence; dividends, interest, and rent; and personal current transfer receipts received by the residents of New Haven. In 2001 net earnings accounted for 69.9 percent of TPI (compared with 68.5 in 1991); dividends, interest, and rent were 15.8 percent (compared with 18.1 in 1991); and personal current transfer receipts were 14.3 percent (compared with 13.4 in 1991). From 2000 to 2001 net earnings increased 3.4 percent; dividends, interest, and rent decreased 1.0 percent; and personal current transfer receipts increased 5.7 percent. From 1991 to 2001 net earnings increased on average 4.7 percent each year; dividends, interest, and rent increased on average 3.0 percent; and personal current transfer receipts increased on average 5.2 percent.

EARNINGS BY PLACE OF WORK

Earnings of persons employed in New Haven increased from \$20,062,965* in 2000 to \$20,556,960* in 2001, an increase of 2.5 percent. The 2000-2001 state change was 4.7 percent and the national change was 3.1 percent. The average annual growth rate from the 1991 estimate of \$13,043,501* to the 2001 estimate was 4.7 percent. The average annual growth rate for the state was 5.6 percent and for the nation was 5.8 percent.
