



BEARFACTS 1991 – 2001

Sioux , Nebraska [31165]

Sioux is one of 93 counties in Nebraska. It is not part of a Metropolitan Area. Its 2001 population of 1,399 ranked 81st in the state.

PER CAPITA PERSONAL INCOME

In 2001 Sioux had a per capita personal income (PCPI) of \$13,641. This PCPI ranked 88th in the state and was 48 percent of the state average, \$28,703, and 45 percent of the national average, \$30,582. The 2001 PCPI reflected an increase of 10.5 percent from 2000. The 2000-2001 state change was 3.9 percent and the national change was 2.5 percent. In 1991 the PCPI of Sioux was \$14,227 and ranked 79th in the state. The 1991-2001 average annual growth rate of PCPI was - 0.4 percent. The average annual growth rate for the state was 4.5 percent and for the nation was 4.4 percent.

TOTAL PERSONAL INCOME

In 2001 Sioux had a total personal income (TPI) of \$19,084*. This TPI ranked 83rd in the state and accounted for 0.0 percent of the state total. In 1991 the TPI of Sioux was \$21,867* and ranked 82nd in the state. The 2001 TPI reflected an increase of 5.2 percent from 2000. The 2000-2001 state change was 4.2 percent and the national change was 3.5 percent. The 1991-2001 average annual growth rate of TPI was - 1.4 percent. The average annual growth rate for the state was 5.2 percent and for the nation was 5.6 percent.

COMPONENTS OF TOTAL PERSONAL INCOME

Total personal income includes net earnings by place of residence; dividends, interest, and rent; and personal current transfer receipts received by the residents of Sioux. In 2001 net earnings accounted for 41.0 percent of TPI (compared with 67.4 in 1991); dividends, interest, and rent were 39.4 percent (compared with 24.0 in 1991); and personal current transfer receipts were 19.6 percent (compared with 8.6 in 1991). From 2000 to 2001 net earnings increased 1.9 percent; dividends, interest, and rent increased 6.6 percent; and personal current transfer receipts increased 9.5 percent. From 1991 to 2001 net earnings decreased on average 6.1 percent each year; dividends, interest, and rent increased on average 3.7 percent; and personal current transfer receipts increased on average 7.1 percent.

EARNINGS BY PLACE OF WORK

Earnings of persons employed in Sioux decreased from \$504* in 2000 to \$- 56* in 2001. The 2000-2001 state change was 4.3 percent and the national change was 3.1 percent. The average annual growth rate from the 1991 estimate of \$11,787* to the 2001 estimate cannot be calculated. The average annual growth rate for the state was 5.2 percent and for the nation was 5.8 percent.

**Note: All income estimates with the exception of PCPI are in thousands of dollars, not adjusted for inflation.*

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
