



## **BEARFACTS 1991 – 2001**

### **Nye , Nevada [32023]**

Nye is one of 17 counties in Nevada. It is part of the Pahrump, NV Micropolitan SA. Its 2001 population of 33,868 ranked 7th in the state.

#### **PER CAPITA PERSONAL INCOME**

In 2001 Nye had a per capita personal income (PCPI) of \$24,340. This PCPI ranked 12th in the state and was 79 percent of the state average, \$30,739, and 80 percent of the national average, \$30,582. The 2001 PCPI reflected an increase of 1.2 percent from 2000. The 2000-2001 state change was 1.0 percent and the national change was 2.5 percent. In 1991 the PCPI of Nye was \$16,774 and ranked 13th in the state. The 1991-2001 average annual growth rate of PCPI was 3.8 percent. The average annual growth rate for the state was 4.0 percent and for the nation was 4.4 percent.

#### **TOTAL PERSONAL INCOME**

In 2001 Nye had a total personal income (TPI) of \$824,353\*. This TPI ranked 7th in the state and accounted for 1.3 percent of the state total. In 1991 the TPI of Nye was \$317,241\* and ranked 7th in the state. The 2001 TPI reflected an increase of 3.5 percent from 2000. The 2000-2001 state change was 4.8 percent and the national change was 3.5 percent. The 1991-2001 average annual growth rate of TPI was 10.0 percent. The average annual growth rate for the state was 9.1 percent and for the nation was 5.6 percent.

#### **COMPONENTS OF TOTAL PERSONAL INCOME**

Total personal income includes net earnings by place of residence; dividends, interest, and rent; and personal current transfer receipts received by the residents of Nye. In 2001 net earnings accounted for 58.6 percent of TPI (compared with 66.3 in 1991); dividends, interest, and rent were 21.0 percent (compared with 19.1 in 1991); and personal current transfer receipts were 20.4 percent (compared with 14.6 in 1991). From 2000 to 2001 net earnings decreased 0.3 percent; dividends, interest, and rent increased 4.1 percent; and personal current transfer receipts increased 15.3 percent. From 1991 to 2001 net earnings increased on average 8.7 percent each year; dividends, interest, and rent increased on average 11.0 percent; and personal current transfer receipts increased on average 13.8 percent.

#### **EARNINGS BY PLACE OF WORK**

Earnings of persons employed in Nye decreased from \$464,195\* in 2000 to \$435,462\* in 2001, a decrease of 6.2 percent. The 2000-2001 state change was 4.4 percent and the national change was 3.1 percent. The average annual growth rate from the 1991 estimate of \$458,733\* to the 2001 estimate was - 0.5 percent. The average annual growth rate for the state was 9.0 percent and for the nation was 5.8 percent.
