



BEARFACTS 1991 – 2001

Lincoln , New Mexico [35027]

Lincoln is one of 33 counties in New Mexico. It is part of the Ruidoso, NM Micropolitan SA. Its 2001 population of 19,425 ranked 19th in the state.

PER CAPITA PERSONAL INCOME

In 2001 Lincoln had a per capita personal income (PCPI) of \$20,314. This PCPI ranked 13th in the state and was 84 percent of the state average, \$24,141, and 66 percent of the national average, \$30,582. The 2001 PCPI reflected an increase of 6.9 percent from 2000. The 2000-2001 state change was 9.0 percent and the national change was 2.5 percent. In 1991 the PCPI of Lincoln was \$16,342 and ranked 4th in the state. The 1991-2001 average annual growth rate of PCPI was 2.2 percent. The average annual growth rate for the state was 4.4 percent and for the nation was 4.4 percent.

TOTAL PERSONAL INCOME

In 2001 Lincoln had a total personal income (TPI) of \$394,603*. This TPI ranked 20th in the state and accounted for 0.9 percent of the state total. In 1991 the TPI of Lincoln was \$210,659* and ranked 21st in the state. The 2001 TPI reflected an increase of 6.3 percent from 2000. The 2000-2001 state change was 9.5 percent and the national change was 3.5 percent. The 1991-2001 average annual growth rate of TPI was 6.5 percent. The average annual growth rate for the state was 6.1 percent and for the nation was 5.6 percent.

COMPONENTS OF TOTAL PERSONAL INCOME

Total personal income includes net earnings by place of residence; dividends, interest, and rent; and personal current transfer receipts received by the residents of Lincoln. In 2001 net earnings accounted for 48.1 percent of TPI (compared with 48.2 in 1991); dividends, interest, and rent were 29.9 percent (compared with 31.8 in 1991); and personal current transfer receipts were 22.0 percent (compared with 19.9 in 1991). From 2000 to 2001 net earnings increased 3.8 percent; dividends, interest, and rent increased 6.7 percent; and personal current transfer receipts increased 11.5 percent. From 1991 to 2001 net earnings increased on average 6.5 percent each year; dividends, interest, and rent increased on average 5.8 percent; and personal current transfer receipts increased on average 7.5 percent.

EARNINGS BY PLACE OF WORK

Earnings of persons employed in Lincoln increased from \$190,452* in 2000 to \$195,701* in 2001, an increase of 2.8 percent. The 2000-2001 state change was 9.4 percent and the national change was 3.1 percent. The average annual growth rate from the 1991 estimate of \$112,803* to the 2001 estimate was 5.7 percent. The average annual growth rate for the state was 5.9 percent and for the nation was 5.8 percent.
