



BEARFACTS 1991 – 2001

Burke , North Dakota [38013]

Burke is one of 53 counties in North Dakota. It is not part of a Metropolitan Area. Its 2001 population of 2,165 ranked 47th in the state.

PER CAPITA PERSONAL INCOME

In 2001 Burke had a per capita personal income (PCPI) of \$23,699. This PCPI ranked 33rd in the state and was 92 percent of the state average, \$25,880, and 77 percent of the national average, \$30,582. The 2001 PCPI reflected a decrease of 10.6 percent from 2000. The 2000-2001 state change was 3.1 percent and the national change was 2.5 percent. In 1991 the PCPI of Burke was \$14,368 and ranked 34th in the state. The 1991-2001 average annual growth rate of PCPI was 5.1 percent. The average annual growth rate for the state was 4.7 percent and for the nation was 4.4 percent.

TOTAL PERSONAL INCOME

In 2001 Burke had a total personal income (TPI) of \$51,309*. This TPI ranked 48th in the state and accounted for 0.3 percent of the state total. In 1991 the TPI of Burke was \$40,375* and ranked 45th in the state. The 2001 TPI reflected a decrease of 13.2 percent from 2000. The 2000-2001 state change was 2.3 percent and the national change was 3.5 percent. The 1991-2001 average annual growth rate of TPI was 2.4 percent. The average annual growth rate for the state was 4.8 percent and for the nation was 5.6 percent.

COMPONENTS OF TOTAL PERSONAL INCOME

Total personal income includes net earnings by place of residence; dividends, interest, and rent; and personal current transfer receipts received by the residents of Burke. In 2001 net earnings accounted for 43.4 percent of TPI (compared with 42.2 in 1991); dividends, interest, and rent were 33.9 percent (compared with 35.1 in 1991); and personal current transfer receipts were 22.7 percent (compared with 22.7 in 1991). From 2000 to 2001 net earnings decreased 27.0 percent; dividends, interest, and rent increased 0.6 percent; and personal current transfer receipts increased 2.8 percent. From 1991 to 2001 net earnings increased on average 2.7 percent each year; dividends, interest, and rent increased on average 2.1 percent; and personal current transfer receipts increased on average 2.4 percent.

EARNINGS BY PLACE OF WORK

Earnings of persons employed in Burke decreased from \$33,409* in 2000 to \$25,329* in 2001, a decrease of 24.2 percent. The 2000-2001 state change was 2.3 percent and the national change was 3.1 percent. The average annual growth rate from the 1991 estimate of \$18,866* to the 2001 estimate was 3.0 percent. The average annual growth rate for the state was 5.1 percent and for the nation was 5.8 percent.
