



BEARFACTS 1991 – 2001

Mercer , Ohio [39107]

Mercer is one of 88 counties in Ohio. It is part of the Celina, OH Micropolitan SA. Its 2001 population of 40,787 ranked 61st in the state.

PER CAPITA PERSONAL INCOME

In 2001 Mercer had a per capita personal income (PCPI) of \$25,438. This PCPI ranked 35th in the state and was 89 percent of the state average, \$28,585, and 83 percent of the national average, \$30,582. The 2001 PCPI remained unchanged from 2000. The 2000-2001 state change was 1.3 percent and the national change was 2.5 percent. In 1991 the PCPI of Mercer was \$17,467 and ranked 31st in the state. The 1991-2001 average annual growth rate of PCPI was 3.8 percent. The average annual growth rate for the state was 4.1 percent and for the nation was 4.4 percent.

TOTAL PERSONAL INCOME

In 2001 Mercer had a total personal income (TPI) of \$1,037,546*. This TPI ranked 56th in the state and accounted for 0.3 percent of the state total. In 1991 the TPI of Mercer was \$693,351* and ranked 56th in the state. The 2001 TPI reflected a decrease of 0.3 percent from 2000. The 2000-2001 state change was 1.6 percent and the national change was 3.5 percent. The 1991-2001 average annual growth rate of TPI was 4.1 percent. The average annual growth rate for the state was 4.5 percent and for the nation was 5.6 percent.

COMPONENTS OF TOTAL PERSONAL INCOME

Total personal income includes net earnings by place of residence; dividends, interest, and rent; and personal current transfer receipts received by the residents of Mercer. In 2001 net earnings accounted for 64.8 percent of TPI (compared with 66.2 in 1991); dividends, interest, and rent were 20.1 percent (compared with 20.6 in 1991); and personal current transfer receipts were 15.1 percent (compared with 13.2 in 1991). From 2000 to 2001 net earnings decreased 2.6 percent; dividends, interest, and rent increased 0.2 percent; and personal current transfer receipts increased 10.1 percent. From 1991 to 2001 net earnings increased on average 3.9 percent each year; dividends, interest, and rent increased on average 3.9 percent; and personal current transfer receipts increased on average 5.5 percent.

EARNINGS BY PLACE OF WORK

Earnings of persons employed in Mercer decreased from \$590,522* in 2000 to \$583,148* in 2001, a decrease of 1.2 percent. The 2000-2001 state change was 1.3 percent and the national change was 3.1 percent. The average annual growth rate from the 1991 estimate of \$458,075* to the 2001 estimate was 2.4 percent. The average annual growth rate for the state was 4.7 percent and for the nation was 5.8 percent.
