



## **BEARFACTS 1991 – 2001 Ottawa , Oklahoma [40115]**

Ottawa is one of 77 counties in Oklahoma. It is part of the Miami, OK Micropolitan SA. Its 2001 population of 33,037 ranked 30th in the state.

### **PER CAPITA PERSONAL INCOME**

In 2001 Ottawa had a per capita personal income (PCPI) of \$19,499. This PCPI ranked 56th in the state and was 75 percent of the state average, \$26,033, and 64 percent of the national average, \$30,582. The 2001 PCPI reflected an increase of 4.3 percent from 2000. The 2000-2001 state change was 6.6 percent and the national change was 2.5 percent. In 1991 the PCPI of Ottawa was \$14,067 and ranked 37th in the state. The 1991-2001 average annual growth rate of PCPI was 3.3 percent. The average annual growth rate for the state was 4.6 percent and for the nation was 4.4 percent.

### **TOTAL PERSONAL INCOME**

In 2001 Ottawa had a total personal income (TPI) of \$644,199\*. This TPI ranked 31st in the state and accounted for 0.7 percent of the state total. In 1991 the TPI of Ottawa was \$431,876\* and ranked 25th in the state. The 2001 TPI reflected an increase of 3.7 percent from 2000. The 2000-2001 state change was 6.9 percent and the national change was 3.5 percent. The 1991-2001 average annual growth rate of TPI was 4.1 percent. The average annual growth rate for the state was 5.5 percent and for the nation was 5.6 percent.

### **COMPONENTS OF TOTAL PERSONAL INCOME**

Total personal income includes net earnings by place of residence; dividends, interest, and rent; and personal current transfer receipts received by the residents of Ottawa. In 2001 net earnings accounted for 55.9 percent of TPI (compared with 56.7 in 1991); dividends, interest, and rent were 16.2 percent (compared with 19.0 in 1991); and personal current transfer receipts were 27.8 percent (compared with 24.3 in 1991). From 2000 to 2001 net earnings increased 1.0 percent; dividends, interest, and rent increased 1.4 percent; and personal current transfer receipts increased 11.1 percent. From 1991 to 2001 net earnings increased on average 3.9 percent each year; dividends, interest, and rent increased on average 2.5 percent; and personal current transfer receipts increased on average 5.5 percent.

### **EARNINGS BY PLACE OF WORK**

Earnings of persons employed in Ottawa increased from \$342,853\* in 2000 to \$343,368\* in 2001, an increase of 0.2 percent. The 2000-2001 state change was 7.7 percent and the national change was 3.1 percent. The average annual growth rate from the 1991 estimate of \$236,823\* to the 2001 estimate was 3.8 percent. The average annual growth rate for the state was 5.6 percent and for the nation was 5.8 percent.
