



## **BEARFACTS 1991 – 2001**

### **Lebanon , Pennsylvania [42075]**

Lebanon is one of 67 counties in Pennsylvania. It is part of the [Lebanon, PA \(MSA\)](#). Its 2001 population of 120,819 ranked 28th in the state.

#### **PER CAPITA PERSONAL INCOME**

In 2001 Lebanon had a per capita personal income (PCPI) of \$26,964. This PCPI ranked 18th in the state and was 89 percent of the state average, \$30,310, and 88 percent of the national average, \$30,582. The 2001 PCPI reflected an increase of 2.3 percent from 2000. The 2000-2001 state change was 2.1 percent and the national change was 2.5 percent. In 1991 the PCPI of Lebanon was \$18,316 and ranked 17th in the state. The 1991-2001 average annual growth rate of PCPI was 3.9 percent. The average annual growth rate for the state was 4.1 percent and for the nation was 4.4 percent.

#### **TOTAL PERSONAL INCOME**

In 2001 Lebanon had a total personal income (TPI) of \$3,257,728\*. This TPI ranked 27th in the state and accounted for 0.9 percent of the state total. In 1991 the TPI of Lebanon was \$2,110,884\* and ranked 26th in the state. The 2001 TPI reflected an increase of 2.6 percent from 2000. The 2000-2001 state change was 2.1 percent and the national change was 3.5 percent. The 1991-2001 average annual growth rate of TPI was 4.4 percent. The average annual growth rate for the state was 4.4 percent and for the nation was 5.6 percent.

#### **COMPONENTS OF TOTAL PERSONAL INCOME**

Total personal income includes net earnings by place of residence; dividends, interest, and rent; and personal current transfer receipts received by the residents of Lebanon. In 2001 net earnings accounted for 66.6 percent of TPI (compared with 66.4 in 1991); dividends, interest, and rent were 17.1 percent (compared with 18.9 in 1991); and personal current transfer receipts were 16.3 percent (compared with 14.7 in 1991). From 2000 to 2001 net earnings increased 2.9 percent; dividends, interest, and rent decreased 3.6 percent; and personal current transfer receipts increased 8.8 percent. From 1991 to 2001 net earnings increased on average 4.5 percent each year; dividends, interest, and rent increased on average 3.4 percent; and personal current transfer receipts increased on average 5.5 percent.

#### **EARNINGS BY PLACE OF WORK**

Earnings of persons employed in Lebanon increased from \$1,716,729\* in 2000 to \$1,791,314\* in 2001, an increase of 4.3 percent. The 2000-2001 state change was 2.0 percent and the national change was 3.1 percent. The average annual growth rate from the 1991 estimate of \$1,214,530\* to the 2001 estimate was 4.0 percent. The average annual growth rate for the state was 4.5 percent and for the nation was 5.8 percent.
