



BEARFACTS 1991 – 2001

Borden , Texas [48033]

Borden is one of 254 counties in Texas. It is not part of a Metropolitan Area. Its 2001 population of 677 ranked 251st in the state.

PER CAPITA PERSONAL INCOME

In 2001 Borden had a per capita personal income (PCPI) of \$18,851. This PCPI ranked 210th in the state and was 65 percent of the state average, \$29,045, and 62 percent of the national average, \$30,582. The 2001 PCPI reflected an increase of 5.8 percent from 2000. The 2000-2001 state change was 2.6 percent and the national change was 2.5 percent. In 1991 the PCPI of Borden was \$17,649 and ranked 45th in the state. The 1991-2001 average annual growth rate of PCPI was 0.7 percent. The average annual growth rate for the state was 4.9 percent and for the nation was 4.4 percent.

TOTAL PERSONAL INCOME

In 2001 Borden had a total personal income (TPI) of \$12,762*. This TPI ranked 251st in the state and accounted for 0.0 percent of the state total. In 1991 the TPI of Borden was \$13,343* and ranked 250th in the state. The 2001 TPI reflected an increase of 0.2 percent from 2000. The 2000-2001 state change was 4.5 percent and the national change was 3.5 percent. The 1991-2001 average annual growth rate of TPI was - 0.4 percent. The average annual growth rate for the state was 7.1 percent and for the nation was 5.6 percent.

COMPONENTS OF TOTAL PERSONAL INCOME

Total personal income includes net earnings by place of residence; dividends, interest, and rent; and personal current transfer receipts received by the residents of Borden. In 2001 net earnings accounted for 48.6 percent of TPI (compared with 73.8 in 1991); dividends, interest, and rent were 38.8 percent (compared with 20.3 in 1991); and personal current transfer receipts were 12.6 percent (compared with 6.0 in 1991). From 2000 to 2001 net earnings decreased 8.6 percent; dividends, interest, and rent increased 12.3 percent; and personal current transfer receipts increased 4.1 percent. From 1991 to 2001 net earnings decreased on average 4.5 percent each year; dividends, interest, and rent increased on average 6.2 percent; and personal current transfer receipts increased on average 7.3 percent.

EARNINGS BY PLACE OF WORK

Earnings of persons employed in Borden decreased from \$4,064* in 2000 to \$3,114* in 2001, a decrease of 23.4 percent. The 2000-2001 state change was 4.6 percent and the national change was 3.1 percent. The average annual growth rate from the 1991 estimate of \$9,062* to the 2001 estimate was - 10.1 percent. The average annual growth rate for the state was 7.5 percent and for the nation was 5.8 percent.
