



BEARFACTS 1991 – 2001

Houston , Texas [48225]

Houston is one of 254 counties in Texas. It is not part of a Metropolitan Area. Its 2001 population of 23,026 ranked 102nd in the state.

PER CAPITA PERSONAL INCOME

In 2001 Houston had a per capita personal income (PCPI) of \$22,796. This PCPI ranked 115th in the state and was 78 percent of the state average, \$29,045, and 75 percent of the national average, \$30,582. The 2001 PCPI reflected an increase of 2.4 percent from 2000. The 2000-2001 state change was 2.6 percent and the national change was 2.5 percent. In 1991 the PCPI of Houston was \$13,978 and ranked 163rd in the state. The 1991-2001 average annual growth rate of PCPI was 5.0 percent. The average annual growth rate for the state was 4.9 percent and for the nation was 4.4 percent.

TOTAL PERSONAL INCOME

In 2001 Houston had a total personal income (TPI) of \$524,900*. This TPI ranked 103rd in the state and accounted for 0.1 percent of the state total. In 1991 the TPI of Houston was \$301,418* and ranked 103rd in the state. The 2001 TPI reflected an increase of 1.8 percent from 2000. The 2000-2001 state change was 4.5 percent and the national change was 3.5 percent. The 1991-2001 average annual growth rate of TPI was 5.7 percent. The average annual growth rate for the state was 7.1 percent and for the nation was 5.6 percent.

COMPONENTS OF TOTAL PERSONAL INCOME

Total personal income includes net earnings by place of residence; dividends, interest, and rent; and personal current transfer receipts received by the residents of Houston. In 2001 net earnings accounted for 60.0 percent of TPI (compared with 55.4 in 1991); dividends, interest, and rent were 17.1 percent (compared with 21.7 in 1991); and personal current transfer receipts were 22.9 percent (compared with 22.9 in 1991). From 2000 to 2001 net earnings decreased 0.9 percent; dividends, interest, and rent increased 5.0 percent; and personal current transfer receipts increased 7.2 percent. From 1991 to 2001 net earnings increased on average 6.6 percent each year; dividends, interest, and rent increased on average 3.2 percent; and personal current transfer receipts increased on average 5.7 percent.

EARNINGS BY PLACE OF WORK

Earnings of persons employed in Houston increased from \$341,839* in 2000 to \$359,318* in 2001, an increase of 5.1 percent. The 2000-2001 state change was 4.6 percent and the national change was 3.1 percent. The average annual growth rate from the 1991 estimate of \$176,765* to the 2001 estimate was 7.4 percent. The average annual growth rate for the state was 7.5 percent and for the nation was 5.8 percent.
