



BEARFACTS 1991 – 2001

Young , Texas [48503]

Young is one of 254 counties in Texas. It is not part of a Metropolitan Area. Its 2001 population of 17,647 ranked 127th in the state.

PER CAPITA PERSONAL INCOME

In 2001 Young had a per capita personal income (PCPI) of \$25,671. This PCPI ranked 56th in the state and was 88 percent of the state average, \$29,045, and 84 percent of the national average, \$30,582. The 2001 PCPI reflected an increase of 1.5 percent from 2000. The 2000-2001 state change was 2.6 percent and the national change was 2.5 percent. In 1991 the PCPI of Young was \$16,809 and ranked 58th in the state. The 1991-2001 average annual growth rate of PCPI was 4.3 percent. The average annual growth rate for the state was 4.9 percent and for the nation was 4.4 percent.

TOTAL PERSONAL INCOME

In 2001 Young had a total personal income (TPI) of \$453,022*. This TPI ranked 116th in the state and accounted for 0.1 percent of the state total. In 1991 the TPI of Young was \$300,700* and ranked 105th in the state. The 2001 TPI remained unchanged from 2000. The 2000-2001 state change was 4.5 percent and the national change was 3.5 percent. The 1991-2001 average annual growth rate of TPI was 4.2 percent. The average annual growth rate for the state was 7.1 percent and for the nation was 5.6 percent.

COMPONENTS OF TOTAL PERSONAL INCOME

Total personal income includes net earnings by place of residence; dividends, interest, and rent; and personal current transfer receipts received by the residents of Young. In 2001 net earnings accounted for 55.8 percent of TPI (compared with 54.2 in 1991); dividends, interest, and rent were 23.0 percent (compared with 27.1 in 1991); and personal current transfer receipts were 21.2 percent (compared with 18.6 in 1991). From 2000 to 2001 net earnings decreased 3.3 percent; dividends, interest, and rent increased 2.2 percent; and personal current transfer receipts increased 7.2 percent. From 1991 to 2001 net earnings increased on average 4.5 percent each year; dividends, interest, and rent increased on average 2.5 percent; and personal current transfer receipts increased on average 5.6 percent.

EARNINGS BY PLACE OF WORK

Earnings of persons employed in Young decreased from \$281,889* in 2000 to \$274,058* in 2001, a decrease of 2.8 percent. The 2000-2001 state change was 4.6 percent and the national change was 3.1 percent. The average annual growth rate from the 1991 estimate of \$182,762* to the 2001 estimate was 4.1 percent. The average annual growth rate for the state was 7.5 percent and for the nation was 5.8 percent.
