



BEARFACTS 1991 – 2001

James City + Williamsburg , Virginia [51931]

James City + Williamsburg is one of 105 counties in Virginia. It is part of the [Virginia Beach-Norfolk-Newport News, VA-NC \(MSA\)](#). Its 2001 population of 61,478 ranked 33rd in the state.

PER CAPITA PERSONAL INCOME

In 2001 James City + Williamsburg had a per capita personal income (PCPI) of \$37,250. This PCPI ranked 7th in the state and was 115 percent of the state average, \$32,521, and 122 percent of the national average, \$30,582. The 2001 PCPI reflected an increase of 6.9 percent from 2000. The 2000-2001 state change was 4.6 percent and the national change was 2.5 percent. In 1991 the PCPI of James City + Williamsburg was \$21,557 and ranked 14th in the state. The 1991-2001 average annual growth rate of PCPI was 5.6 percent. The average annual growth rate for the state was 4.5 percent and for the nation was 4.4 percent.

TOTAL PERSONAL INCOME

In 2001 James City + Williamsburg had a total personal income (TPI) of \$2,290,040*. This TPI ranked 26th in the state and accounted for 1.0 percent of the state total. In 1991 the TPI of James City + Williamsburg was \$1,035,012* and ranked 31st in the state. The 2001 TPI reflected an increase of 8.7 percent from 2000. The 2000-2001 state change was 5.9 percent and the national change was 3.5 percent. The 1991-2001 average annual growth rate of TPI was 8.3 percent. The average annual growth rate for the state was 5.9 percent and for the nation was 5.6 percent.

COMPONENTS OF TOTAL PERSONAL INCOME

Total personal income includes net earnings by place of residence; dividends, interest, and rent; and personal current transfer receipts received by the residents of James City + Williamsburg. In 2001 net earnings accounted for 61.3 percent of TPI (compared with 65.5 in 1991); dividends, interest, and rent were 28.2 percent (compared with 24.4 in 1991); and personal current transfer receipts were 10.5 percent (compared with 10.0 in 1991). From 2000 to 2001 net earnings increased 8.4 percent; dividends, interest, and rent increased 8.2 percent; and personal current transfer receipts increased 11.3 percent. From 1991 to 2001 net earnings increased on average 7.6 percent each year; dividends, interest, and rent increased on average 9.8 percent; and personal current transfer receipts increased on average 8.7 percent.

EARNINGS BY PLACE OF WORK

Earnings of persons employed in James City + Williamsburg increased from \$1,431,625* in 2000 to \$1,525,525* in 2001, an increase of 6.6 percent. The 2000-2001 state change was 6.1 percent and the national change was 3.1 percent. The average annual growth rate from the 1991 estimate of \$821,809* to the 2001 estimate was 6.4 percent. The average annual growth rate for the state was 6.3 percent and for the nation was 5.8 percent.
