



BEARFACTS 1992 – 2002 Imperial , California [06025]

Imperial is one of 58 counties in California. It is part of the [El Centro, CA \(MSA\)](#). Its 2002 population of 144,629 ranked 31st in the state.

PER CAPITA PERSONAL INCOME

In 2002 Imperial had a per capita personal income (PCPI) of \$20,641. This PCPI ranked 52nd in the state and was 63 percent of the state average, \$32,870, and 67 percent of the national average, \$30,838. The 2002 PCPI reflected an increase of 7.8 percent from 2001. The 2001-2002 state change was -0.1 percent and the national change was 0.8 percent. In 1992 the PCPI of Imperial was \$15,369 and ranked 52nd in the state. The 1992-2002 average annual growth rate of PCPI was 3.0 percent. The average annual growth rate for the state was 3.9 percent and for the nation was 4.0 percent.

TOTAL PERSONAL INCOME

In 2002 Imperial had a total personal income (TPI) of \$2,985,254*. This TPI ranked 33rd in the state and accounted for 0.3 percent of the state total. In 1992 the TPI of Imperial was \$1,903,060* and ranked 33rd in the state. The 2002 TPI reflected an increase of 8.9 percent from 2001. The 2001-2002 state change was 1.1 percent and the national change was 1.8 percent. The 1992-2002 average annual growth rate of TPI was 4.6 percent. The average annual growth rate for the state was 5.1 percent and for the nation was 5.2 percent.

COMPONENTS OF TOTAL PERSONAL INCOME

Total personal income includes net earnings by place of residence; dividends, interest, and rent; and personal current transfer receipts received by the residents of Imperial. In 2002 net earnings accounted for 66.1 percent of TPI (compared with 66.2 in 1992); dividends, interest, and rent were 10.8 percent (compared with 11.2 in 1992); and personal current transfer receipts were 23.1 percent (compared with 22.6 in 1992). From 2001 to 2002 net earnings increased 11.6 percent; dividends, interest, and rent decreased 3.8 percent; and personal current transfer receipts increased 8.0 percent. From 1992 to 2002 net earnings increased on average 4.6 percent each year; dividends, interest, and rent increased on average 4.2 percent; and personal current transfer receipts increased on average 4.8 percent.

EARNINGS BY PLACE OF WORK

Earnings of persons employed in Imperial increased from \$1,981,020* in 2001 to \$2,204,733* in 2002, an increase of 11.3 percent. The 2001-2002 state change was 1.6 percent and the national change was 2.1 percent. The average annual growth rate from the 1992 estimate of \$1,464,021* to the 2002 estimate was 4.2 percent. The average annual growth rate for the state was 5.3 percent and for the nation was 5.4 percent.
