



BEARFACTS 1992 – 2002

New York , New York [36061]

New York is one of 62 counties in New York. It is part of the [New York-Northern New Jersey-Long Island, NY-NJ-PA \(MSA\)](#). Its 2002 population of 1,565,477 ranked 3rd in the state.

PER CAPITA PERSONAL INCOME

In 2002 New York had a per capita personal income (PCPI) of \$82,262. This PCPI ranked 1st in the state and was 233 percent of the state average, \$35,363, and 267 percent of the national average, \$30,838. The 2002 PCPI reflected a decrease of 4.4 percent from 2001. The 2001-2002 state change was -0.7 percent and the national change was 0.8 percent. In 1992 the PCPI of New York was \$54,896 and ranked 1st in the state. The 1992-2002 average annual growth rate of PCPI was 4.1 percent. The average annual growth rate for the state was 3.6 percent and for the nation was 4.0 percent.

TOTAL PERSONAL INCOME

In 2002 New York had a total personal income (TPI) of \$128,779,379*. This TPI ranked 1st in the state and accounted for 19.0 percent of the state total. In 1992 the TPI of New York was \$81,568,466* and ranked 1st in the state. The 2002 TPI reflected a decrease of 4.1 percent from 2001. The 2001-2002 state change was -0.3 percent and the national change was 1.8 percent. The 1992-2002 average annual growth rate of TPI was 4.7 percent. The average annual growth rate for the state was 4.1 percent and for the nation was 5.2 percent.

COMPONENTS OF TOTAL PERSONAL INCOME

Total personal income includes net earnings by place of residence; dividends, interest, and rent; and personal current transfer receipts received by the residents of New York. In 2002 net earnings accounted for 73.4 percent of TPI (compared with 69.2 in 1992); dividends, interest, and rent were 16.9 percent (compared with 21.2 in 1992); and personal current transfer receipts were 9.7 percent (compared with 9.6 in 1992). From 2001 to 2002 net earnings decreased 2.6 percent; dividends, interest, and rent decreased 6.6 percent; and personal current transfer receipts decreased 10.5 percent. From 1992 to 2002 net earnings increased on average 5.3 percent each year; dividends, interest, and rent increased on average 2.3 percent; and personal current transfer receipts increased on average 4.7 percent.

EARNINGS BY PLACE OF WORK

Earnings of persons employed in New York decreased from \$251,090,151* in 2001 to \$240,205,183* in 2002, a decrease of 4.3 percent. The 2001-2002 state change was -0.3 percent and the national change was 2.1 percent. The average annual growth rate from the 1992 estimate of \$144,785,037* to the 2002 estimate was 5.2 percent. The average annual growth rate for the state was 4.4 percent and for the nation was 5.4 percent.
