



BEARFACTS 1992 – 2002

Wheeler , Texas [48483]

Wheeler is one of 254 counties in Texas. It is not part of a Metropolitan Area. Its 2002 population of 4,977 ranked 204th in the state.

PER CAPITA PERSONAL INCOME

In 2002 Wheeler had a per capita personal income (PCPI) of \$28,265. This PCPI ranked 27th in the state and was 98 percent of the state average, \$28,858, and 92 percent of the national average, \$30,838. The 2002 PCPI reflected a decrease of 8.8 percent from 2001. The 2001-2002 state change was -0.6 percent and the national change was 0.8 percent. In 1992 the PCPI of Wheeler was \$19,729 and ranked 31st in the state. The 1992-2002 average annual growth rate of PCPI was 3.7 percent. The average annual growth rate for the state was 4.3 percent and for the nation was 4.0 percent.

TOTAL PERSONAL INCOME

In 2002 Wheeler had a total personal income (TPI) of \$140,677*. This TPI ranked 192nd in the state and accounted for 0.0 percent of the state total. In 1992 the TPI of Wheeler was \$110,245* and ranked 182nd in the state. The 2002 TPI reflected a decrease of 11.1 percent from 2001. The 2001-2002 state change was 1.1 percent and the national change was 1.8 percent. The 1992-2002 average annual growth rate of TPI was 2.5 percent. The average annual growth rate for the state was 6.4 percent and for the nation was 5.2 percent.

COMPONENTS OF TOTAL PERSONAL INCOME

Total personal income includes net earnings by place of residence; dividends, interest, and rent; and personal current transfer receipts received by the residents of Wheeler. In 2002 net earnings accounted for 62.6 percent of TPI (compared with 60.7 in 1992); dividends, interest, and rent were 14.1 percent (compared with 18.9 in 1992); and personal current transfer receipts were 23.3 percent (compared with 20.4 in 1992). From 2001 to 2002 net earnings decreased 15.5 percent; dividends, interest, and rent decreased 14.9 percent; and personal current transfer receipts increased 6.6 percent. From 1992 to 2002 net earnings increased on average 2.8 percent each year; dividends, interest, and rent decreased on average 0.5 percent; and personal current transfer receipts increased on average 3.9 percent.

EARNINGS BY PLACE OF WORK

Earnings of persons employed in Wheeler decreased from \$105,869* in 2001 to \$89,457* in 2002, a decrease of 15.5 percent. The 2001-2002 state change was 1.0 percent and the national change was 2.1 percent. The average annual growth rate from the 1992 estimate of \$66,841* to the 2002 estimate was 3.0 percent. The average annual growth rate for the state was 6.8 percent and for the nation was 5.4 percent.
